

CONTRACTS LET FOR GREEN SPRING MT. AND GOLD HILL

PORTLAND, May 8.—The following contracts have been awarded by the state highway commission:

Ashland to Green Springs road, paving 5.85 miles; Oskar Huber, \$185,330.

Green Springs road to California line, paving 14.6 miles; Oskar Huber, \$286,213.

Monroe to Lane county line, grading, 3.24 miles; Benton county, \$33,080.

Comstock Pass, grading and macadamizing, 1 mile; A. Anderson, \$13,080.

Gold Hill to Josephine county line, grading and paving, 12.2 miles; Schell and Calvert, \$274,204.

Island City to LeGrande, paving, 6 miles; Warren Construction company, \$131,182.

Hillsboro to Forest Grove, paving 4.3 miles; Warren Construction company, \$93,709.

Eugene to Goshen, paving 4.9 miles; Guy Pyle, \$97,892.

For grading Sexton mountain in Josephine county, 7.6 miles, the lowest bid was that of H. J. Hildeburn, \$125,055. It was referred to the state highway engineer for future action. The same thing was done in the case of grading and macadamizing 6.7 miles in Josephine county between Jacques' place and John's place on which the lowest bidder was J. T. Logan, \$77,181.

The engineer was instructed to prepare estimates for the following work to be let at the special meeting of the commission May 27: Rocky point bridge near Gold Hill in Jackson county, and grading between Port Orford and Brush creek in Curry county. Owing to the vast amount of detail in tabulating bids the awarding of contracts was continued.

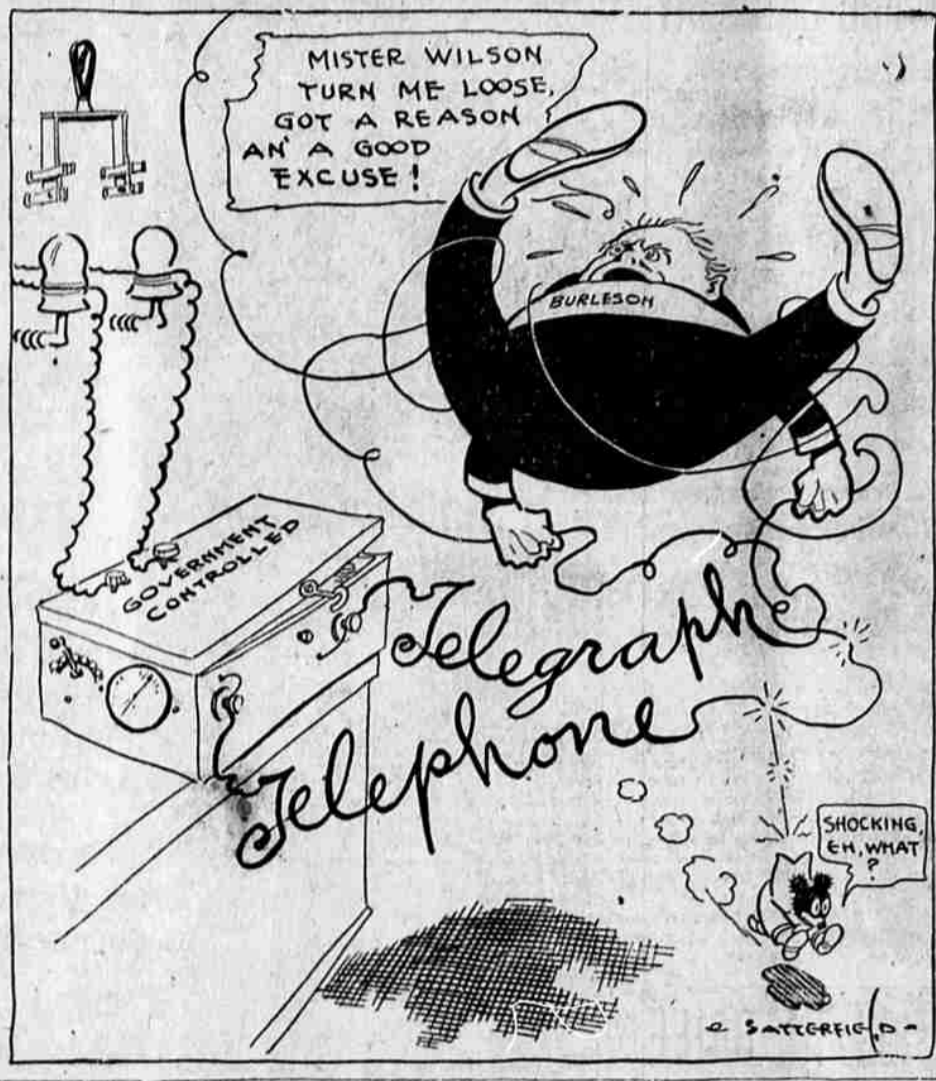
No bids were received for grading and macadamizing 6.7 miles between Roseburg and Dillard and 3.2 miles between Leona and Drain in Douglas county. These two projects will be readvertised. On grading the Pacific highway 6.4 miles between Oregon City and Oswego bids were unopened, it having been decided to make a change of location.

FRANCE TO HAVE AEROPLANE SERVICE AFRICA AND TURKEY

PARIS, May 8.—(Correspondence of Associated Press.) Elaborate plans for international air services are now being worked out by the French government and it is probable that some of them will be inaugurated soon after the peace conference has finished work and promul-

gated its decisions for the control of aviation. In addition France will establish air routes which will be entirely within her own boundaries and therefore under her control alone.

One of the most pretentious schemes is that for a service which will run London-Paris-Marseilles-Rome-Naples-Brindise-Constantinople. Another line will be established between Paris and Morocco, and Paris and Madrid probably will be linked up.

There are at present two services out of Paris, one to London and the other to Lille and Brussels. The former is at the moment for military business only but plans have been laid for a service that will benefit the general public. So far there is no intention to make this a passenger service but the feasibility is being discussed of sending telegrams and special delivery letters between the two capitals by air. It takes only about three hours for the trip so that a telegram could be delivered quicker in this manner than by wire. It is probable that a charge of perhaps three francs would be made for the carrying of letters.

The line between Paris and Brussels is for passengers and an airplane is making one trip a week each way. The fare is about three hundred francs. This service is a private enterprise run by one of the big airplane firms, altho it is government controlled.

Two other firms are about to start similar services with the permission of the government. In view of this it is probable that no regular government service will be established, altho of course, military airplanes are carrying supplies and dispatches to the front daily. The time required to fly to Brussels from Paris is about two hours and a half.

\$27,000,000 SPENT IN HORSES, MULES DURING THE WAR

DALLAS, Tex., May 8.—Demobilization of the army mule and horse is going forward rapidly, according to figures on government sales just compiled by C. O. Moser, livestock inspector of the purchasing quartermaster.

The figures show that during the war the government bought 115,000 head of horses and mules at a total cost of \$27,000,000 in the southern and central purchasing zones. When hostilities ended the government owned about 500,000 head of horses and mules, 300,000 in the United States and 200,000 in France, only 70,000 of the latter number having been shipped from this country.

Because of the big demand for these animals on central west farms the government has been hurrying distribution, and when auctions now advertised are completed 150,000 animals will have been placed on farms since January 1.
