

What You Are Asked to Vote on, Tuesday, June 3rd

Oregon has a great opportunity in the election June 3 to keep in the first rank of forward moving states. The reconstruction measures on the ballot are worthy of support. They mean safe guarding the future and providing for the steady employment of labor. They mean the creation of new taxable wealth and not the raising of taxation.

Oregon has kept in the first rank of patriotic states.

The reconstruction measures were placed on the ballot at the request of the statesmen of the nation and after careful consideration by the legislature.

The \$5,000,000 reconstruction bonding bill provides:

Reclamation

1. \$2,000,000 for reclamation of arid, swamp and loosed off lands, provided the federal government allots Oregon an equal amount. This money will be spent in development of Oregon. The expenditure of \$4,000,000 will create at least \$20,000,000 of new taxable wealth. It will create new values to help bear taxation instead of raising taxes, since every dollar, principal and interest, will be repaid by the settlers. Soldiers, sailors and marines will be given preferential rights under Secretary of the Interior Lane's bill. The purpose of the constitution amendment and the accompanying measure is to enable Oregon to get its share of the federal appropriation if the Lang bill passes.

New Farms

2. \$647,500 for the land settlement commission. This money will be spent in developing new farm homes in all parts of the state which will be sold to settlers, the primary idea being to provide farms for returning soldiers. These will not be given away, but will be paid for on long time, both principal and interest.

3. \$2,352,000 for much needed public buildings throughout the state: New penitentiary to cost not exceeding \$500,000

Reconstruction hospital to cost not exceeding 350,000

Oregon Agricultural college buildings to cost not exceeding 500,000

University of Oregon buildings to cost not exceeding 500,000

State Normal school buildings to cost not exceeding 100,000

State Insane Hospital buildings to cost not exceeding 150,000

Armories to cost not exceeding 207,500

State Soldiers' home 25,000

State Institute for Feeble Minded 20,000

The governor and state board of control have promised that these buildings will not be erected when a labor shortage exists, and that the money will be expended only when conditions as to unemployment exist, making it advisable to proceed with the work in order to give employment to labor.

Thus it will be seen that \$2,647,500 of the proposed fund is a permanent investment fund to be repaid with principal and interest and that the proposed building program depends upon the necessity arising for employing surplus Oregon labor.

Irrigation Bill

The state bond payment of irrigation and drainage interest for the period of five years is designed to make irrigation and drainage district bonds salable at par instead of at ruinous discounts. The state will be protected with liens on the land benefited. This measure will mean the investment of over \$200,000,000 in Oregon within the next five years. The state assures payment of the interest on the settlers' notes for five years enabling them to borrow money at better terms. The principal is not

guaranteed. This measure means development and the creation of more farm homes and additional taxable property.

The Roosevelt Coast Military Highway bill provides \$2,500,000 for a state and national highway along the coast, provided the federal government appropriates \$2,500,000. This highway also means the opening up of a large territory to development and taxation. No money would be spent unless the state appropriation was matched by the federal government. The building of this highway would be equivalent to building another railroad in the state of Oregon.

The soldiers, sailors' and marines' educational financial aid bill will assist the boys to complete their education at Oregon educational institutions. The maximum amount authorized for this purpose would be \$200,000. No boy would get more than \$25 a month. This is a matter of simple justice to the boys who left school to go to war.

The market road tax bill provides a one mill tax to raise approximately \$1,000,000 annually for market roads. Multnomah county will pay \$365,000 of this fund and will receive only \$100,000. Counties receiving benefits from this fund must contribute an equal amount. This bill means the raising of \$2,000,000 annually to be spent on roads to benefit the farmer rather than for main trunk highways in the \$10,000,000 issue.

Oregon voters can do no better than to adopt the whole program, give the returning soldiers a chance to go on the land. Adopting these measures which will make an industrial and economic depression an impossibility in the state and at the same time insure the certainty of steady development of the state resources and the creation of new taxable wealth.

The farmer, the laborer, the business man—all will share equally in the benefits.

The passage of the reconstruction bills means a greater and more prosperous Oregon.

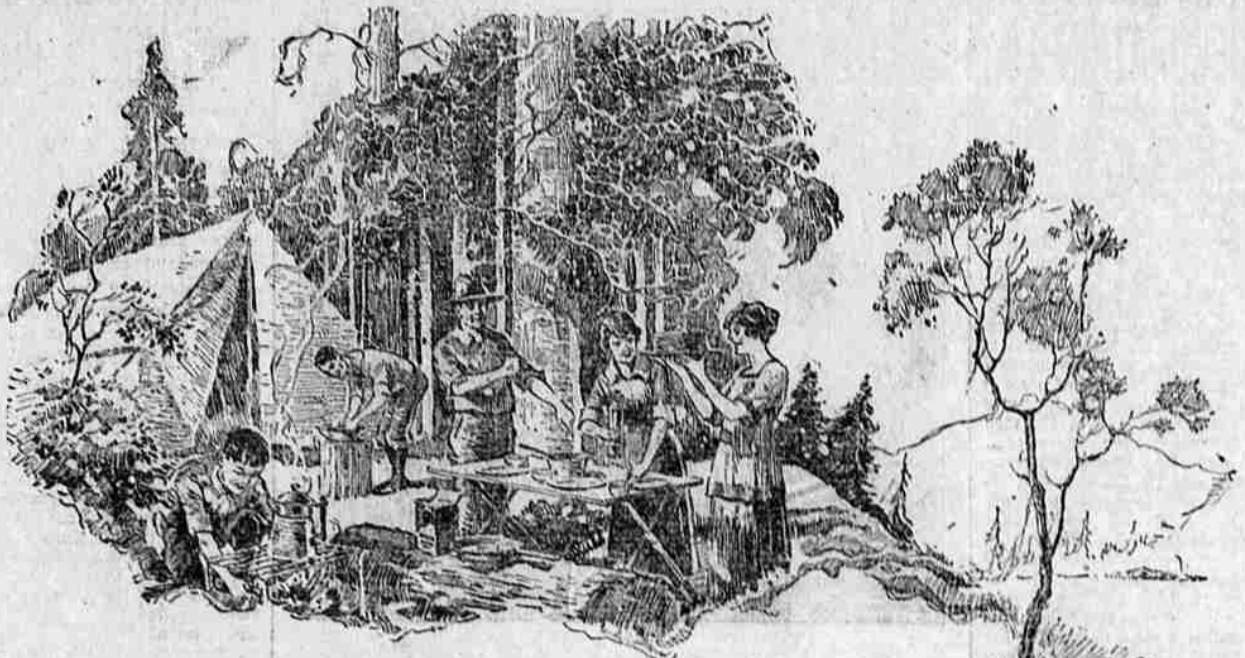
