

# ARMY AEROPLANES ON WAY SOUTH ONE THRU TODAY

What was believed to be the De Haviland plane was sighted passing over Medford at 1:30 p. m. The sky was clear and several people in Medford saw the plane clearly, it passing directly over Siskiyou Heights east of the city.

ALBANY, Ore., June 14.—Five airplanes of the Sacramento flying circus arrived here at 10:25 o'clock today from Portland. They made the flight in one hour and ten minutes. Governor Olcott, who was a passenger in one of the planes, did not stop at Salem, but came to Albany and decided to continue the flight when the planes take the air for Cottage Grove at 2 o'clock.

The DeVaviland plane, piloted by Lieutenant Beck, passed over this place at 11:05 en route to Sacramento, but did not stop. It was reported passing over Eugene at 11:40 o'clock.

PORTLAND, June 14.—Five of the seven army airplanes from Mather Field, Sacramento, took the air at 9:15 o'clock today on the first hop of their return journey, the Portland Victory Rose Festival having ended last night. Lieutenant Colonel Watson and four of his aviators were to stop at Cottage Grove, and stay there over night. Tomorrow, Grants Pass, and Ashland will be on the schedule for stops. Governor Olcott started for Salem, on his return trip by air, with one of the army lieutenants today.

Lieutenant Beck, pilot of the De Haviland airplane, was preparing to leave shortly after the first of the flying circus and to make a direct flight to Sacramento, where he hoped to arrive by six o'clock tonight, he stated.

Lieutenant J. M. Fetter, with one of the Curtiss planes, was left here to make a flight to Seattle, via Tacoma, on Monday. From Washington points he was to fly to Moscow, Idaho, thence to Yellowstone Park and finally to Ogden and Reno, according to plans announced today. His trip was to be made to map out air routes, finding landing fields and generally blaze the way for future flyers. All the data he accumulates on the trip will be turned over to the war department for use of the airplane service.

## FIRE M. F. & H. BLDG QUICKLY CHECKED

The business district of Medford had a fire scare this morning and the M. F. & H. building tenants regard themselves as very fortunate that the fire in the basement of that big structure was discovered in time. Had it gotten a little more headway one of the worst fires in the history of the city might have been the result. As it was the flames were easily extinguished and the loss was comparatively small.

The janitor of the building who was supposed to burn the paper and rubbish from the M. F. & H. store and offices of the various tenants daily, had instead allowed it to accumulate by the waste trash burner beside the furnace. An employee of the company started to burn some of this trash in the burner at 7:45 o'clock this morning and left the basement for a short time during which the big pile of rubbish nearby had caught fire and was fast burning and spreading when discovered.

Smoke poured from the basement windows and was carried upstairs through the hall ways of the several floors. The flames communicated to the heavy wood ceiling and rafters of the basement near the furnace, burning the cable that carried the various electric wires that served the building, thus demoralizing the telephone and electric light system of the structure. Repairs were later made which soon restored the service.

The fire was extinguished by the firemen before it had eaten its way thru the first floor, but the basement ceiling and rafters were badly charred.

## GIRLS CAMP IS TO BE HELD IN VALLEY JULY 14

The girls will live in tents, good meals will be provided and good times are promised. The morning will be used for study classes in the Bible, foreign and home missions and stories for Sunday school classes. The afternoon is to be given to a good time and the evenings will be filled with stories of missions and three evenings of the Chautauqua program. ## 300 SPECIALS WILL RUN TO TOLEDO FOR BIG FIGHT

TOLEDO, Ohio, June 14.—No less than 300 special trains will be run to Toledo for the heavyweight championship contest between Jack Dempsey and Jess Willard on July 4. Tex Rickard, promoter of the contest, said today.

Willard announced today that he expects to weigh within two or three pounds of what he weighed when he won the championship from Jack Johnson in Havana in 1915. Willard tipped the scales at 249½ pounds then and he was only 2½ pounds above that figure when he finished his workout yesterday.

If the cut over Dempsey's damaged eye is sufficiently healed, the challenger will be allowed to resume boxing tomorrow.

Sailor Bill Ketchel, the young heavyweight who joined Willard's staff of sparring partners is on his way back to New York today. Willard sank a left hook into Ketchel's mid-section and he allowed that he had enough.
