MEXICAN SOLONS PROBABLY WILL DODGE OIL LAW

MEXICO CITY, June 17.—With the extraordinary session of congress still considering the labor law, after having completed the third week of its life, rumors are plentiful that neither the oil nationalization law nor the national bank of emission legislation will be considered before the session is adjourned. Hardly more than two scores of the 300 odd provisions of the labor law have been discussed in the chamber of deputies and the debate shows no signs of lessening warmth. Representatives of foreign oil companies and banking institutions, which are vitally interested in the proposed legislation, are found in force in the capital and are using every effort to secure modifications of the proposed laws.
