

SOCIETY WOMEN AID STRIKERS IN S. F. BAY DISTRICT

SAN FRANCISCO, June 19.—Miss Lillian Blewer, business agent for the telephone operators' union of Oakland, Calif., was authorized to represent Miss Julia S. O'Connor, president of the national organization of operators, in the strike of operators in the San Francisco bay district in a telegram received today from Miss O'Connor.

Society women of Oakland, Berkeley and Piedmont are entertaining the striking girls with automobile rides and parties, and are bringing meals to the pickets in front of the various exchanges, Miss Blewer reported.

All parts of the Pacific coast with the exception of the Seattle district, were represented at the session of strike leaders today to arrange a conference with the telephone officials, union officials announced.

Telephone company officials announced their readiness to negotiate. A more acute strike condition was reported today. Many firms were said to have abandoned their telephones in favor of messenger service.
