

WILLARD FIGHT ARENA A MODEL OF CONVIENCE

TOLEDO, Ohio, June 28.—Thrusting its raw, yellow skeleton skyward, the huge bowl-shaped arena, costing \$150,000 and originally planned to seat 30,000 persons, is rapidly nearing completion for the heavyweight championship contest between Jess Willard and Jack Dempsey here July 4.

Some idea of the immensity of the arena may be obtained from the fact that it is four times as large as the arena in which Jack Johnson battered Jim Jeffries to defeat in Reno, Nev., and capable of seating four times as many persons. Approximately 1,750,000 feet of lumber has been used in the structure. Not a bolt has been used, the entire building being held together by nails of which two carloads, or 50,000 pounds have been driven. All new lumber has entered into the construction and this will be sold after the contest.

Precautions against "erching" of the gates also have been taken. Outside the arena 80 feet distant will be a barbed wire fence, of entanglement, eight feet high and a half mile long, to keep the crowd away from the entrances. Closer to the arena will be a board fence 12 feet high, surrounded by barbed wire, while at the top of the arena itself will be a five foot fence of barbed wire with armed guards stationed every 25 feet. The \$10, \$15, \$25 and \$30 and \$40 seats also will be separated from each other by barbed wire to prevent occupants of one section moving into better seats.

There will not be a stairway in the entire arena, which is 600 feet across. Entrances to the various sections will be along inclined runways, with a grade of one foot to every six feet, making the climb scarcely noticeable. The 34 feet from the ground, which will be 24 feet from the ground, will be 180 feet in length.

STATE PRISON IS NOW MINUS BLOODHOUNDS

SALEM, June 28.—After next Monday the state prison will be minus the services of its trained bloodhounds in hunting down escaped convicts. The dogs are the personal property of Joe Keller, parole officer, who retires from the parole service on July 1. Keller has sold one and the other two will be disposed of early next week. The dogs led every man hunted away from the prison for the past two years and also have been pressed into service by various sheriffs of the state to assist in running down jail breakers.

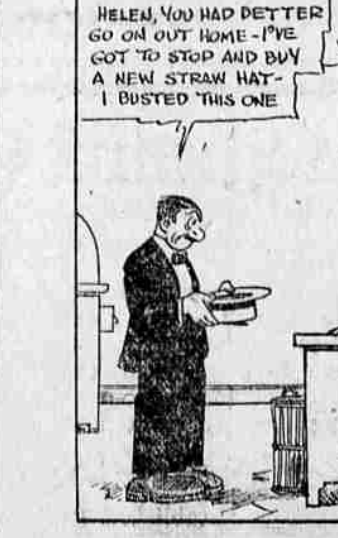
