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GOOD FOR LOWDEN.

"STAMP out the Reds!" cries General Wood. "Bring in the firing squad!" shouts Will H. Hays. And then comes Governor Lowden:

"If every man and woman took the same interest in political matters as in their own personal affairs, most of our ills would disappear. In the war on radicalism there is no more patent argument than home ownership."

Very mild that. Not at all blood curdling or picturesque. Nevertheless we favor the Lowden prescription to the other two.

Stamping out Reds by wholesale deportations, shooting them down in wholesale lots a la Berlin and Petrograd, may reduce the immediate ravages of the radical disease, but will never produce a cure.

The cure lies as Governor Lowden points out, first in an awakening of the individual political responsibility,—America politically articulate, with every voter man and woman, taking a place on the firing line. And second in home ownership,—which means merely making America a country in which every American can easily acquire a property interest,—a simple formula but involving far-reaching economic readjustments.

Where there is smoke there's usually fire, where there is a rash on the epidermis there is usually something wrong with the inner reactions. So where there is persistent disorder, and persistent unrest, there is something more than foreign agitation which produces it. Merely stamping out the superficial manifestations of the radical disease is useless trying to cure small-pox by scraping off the affected epidermis. The wise physician goes deeper.

No with the wise statesman, Governor Lowden will never get votes on a home ownership platform, while "bring in the firing squad!" promises to be a popular campaign slogan, but whereas the former means a good deal, the latter means nothing. For the second merely waves a red flag at a danger, while the first proceeds not only to sense the danger but to remove its cause.

We see by the Oregon Voter that Douglas county leads the state in pear production because the Jackson county assessor did not take the trouble to send in a report to the State Tax Commission. Better get in on this next time.
