Total figures for the winter term will reach 1650, according to Carlton E. Spencer, registrar, while the enrollment last semester was 1550, exclusive of special students. The increased enrollment is due largely to the many former service men returning to their scholastic work. Mid year graduates from high schools also are taking advantage of the new semester for starting their university work.

TEACHERS STUDY PRIMARY GRADES WITH DAVENPORT

The group of instructors comprising the elementary schools met with Superintendent Davenport at the high school building last night in regular session to discuss in an informal way the problems of these primary grades. A very free and interesting meeting was had in analyzing the various situations as presented by the different teachers. The problems particularly considered were those pertaining to the attendance of children before they had attained the age of six years, the fact that it is vital and imperative that boys and girls be encouraged to give expression freely, thereby developing their natural characteristics and that the instructor at all times should endeavor to secure this expression rather than to suppress these natural tendencies.

The request was made that the primary teachers watch closely the working out of the course of study with a view to making helpful suggestions when the course of study will be outlined for the elementary schools as based upon the new text books after having actually used the new books.
