

ASHLAND SELECTS DANCE CHAPERONE PUBLIC FUNCTIONS

ASHLAND, Jan. 12.—"On with the dance!" as a terpsichorean slogan, has evidently been adopted by the city council in the confirmation by that body of a woman who is duly empowered to chaperone these social functions.

Appointees to city department proper have also been confirmed as follows, it being to ordinary to remember that in addition to clerk-stenographers we have engineers, electricians, superintendents and commissioners on the municipal payroll, also attorneys.

Fire department: George Robison, chief; William Myer and John Robinson, assistants.

Police: J. W. Hatcher, chief; Tom Roberts, assistant. F. H. Walker is engineer; Orle S. Easterling, electrician; C. W. Fratey, street commissioner; Earl Hooser, water superintendent.

M. B. Plinton is superintendent of cemeteries, and Amos Graves is executive enforcer of the municipal dump. By all the rules of analogy and coincidence as to applying names to vocations, Graves should be cemetery caretaker.

Other appointive officials include Miss Calla Biegel as assistant recorder. Also to fill vacancies due to resignations, W. M. Briggs in city attorney, in place of L. A. Roberts, and A. E. Kinney as park commissioner, succeeds P. E. Watson, who is temporarily located in San Francisco during the winter. Miss Blanche Hicks, city librarian, is also officially designated as chaperone of the dances.

The city council, having learned wisdom by experience, reserve the right to revoke the foregoing appointments at any time by giving fifteen days notice, appointees to have the privilege of vacating the job by applying the same rule as to notifying the city. This new departure, mutually understood, should prove satisfactory to all concerned.

Heads of departments have several assistants, the water and light utilities necessarily employing the greater number. The municipal payroll is a large one, it being conceded that the head of the electric light department receives the highest individual pay of any employe working for the town.

The mayor also appointed the customary standing committees, the list being extensive and growing in number and importance each year. Prominent is the finance committee, the duties of which are exacting and oftentimes burdensome. C. W. Banta, W. A. Turner and G. M. Frost are on this job, other designations being as follows:
