

PUBLIC HEALTH NURSE IS BUSY TENDING THE SICK

Jackson county, Oregon, in common with thousands of other counties in the United States, has a public health nurse, the only difference being that this kind of work is new in Oregon and quite ancient in other states.

Some one said the other day that he had seen no mention of the public nurse's "activities" and the inference might have been that said nurse did not have any "activities."

The daily journal kept by the nurse of her work shows that nearly two hundred calls were made in the month of December. But, please bear in mind, that the word call may mean sticking a piece of government health literature on baby care, under the door of a home.

Or, it may mean visiting in fifteen minutes in which children were unable to attend school on account of illness.

Or, it may mean trying to make a mother who has very few ideas about home-making, realize that the state of Oregon has laws as to the manner in which children may and may not present themselves in their schools.

Or, it may mean climbing to one of the highest points in Ashland to use if a dear old lady is "comfy."

Or, it may mean a visit to a physician's office for the purpose of asking the doctor to give some "free professional service" and rest assured, the county nurse distributes these calls with perfect fairness.

And, again, be it to the credit of

the medical profession, that every "free" call the nurse has requested a physician to make, has been made with the greatest willingness and cordiality.

Or the word "call" may mean actual bedside nursing work, and may last anywhere from 15 minutes to one hour and a half.

Or, it may be a call in cooperation with the Red Cross home service department.

Even the Elks (bless their generous hearts) have asked the nurse to make some visits.

Then it's a call on the county physician, the local health officer, the county judge, or some other person whose work "touches elbows" loosely with that of the county nurse.

The Medford truant officer and the nurse have many common points of interest in the daily routine of work.

Sometimes a "call" means a talk in a community group of parents or students.

And then there is the office and clerical work to be kept up—many letters to be written, and lastly the publicity work, which just means telling the dear public once in a while that the nurse is really "earning her salary."

COST PRICE PLAN HALTED BY COURT

HELENA, Mont., Jan. 13.—Judge George M. Bourquin in the United States district court here today granted an injunction against the Montana trade commission, halting the operation of the commission's order number four, which would compel retail dealers to mark the cost prices upon goods offered for sale in the state.

Judge Bourquin held that the regulation of prices by a state legislature is contrary to the fourteenth amendment of the United States constitution and issued a permanent injunction against the trade commission's order.

JESUS WILL COME AGAIN DECLARES EVANGELIST RIPPEY

"Let not your hearts be troubled; ye believe in God believe also in me. In my father's house are many mansions; if it were not so I would have told you, I go to prepare a place for you and if I go and prepare a place for you I will come again and receive you unto myself, that where I am there ye may be also," was the text used by Evangelist Rippey Sunday evening in his discourse on the "Second Coming of Christ." He said in part as follows: "Here is a direct promise from Jesus that he will come again." His coming is just as certain as was His going away, for He said, "If I go * * * I will come again." If he come according to this promise, the time will surely be when that coming is near at hand, and we will finally reach the very day of His coming.

The manner of His coming was then briefly considered. Jesus had led his apostles out to Mount Olivet. He had given them final instructions. "While they beheld, He was taken up, and a cloud received Him out of their sight; And while they looked steadfastly toward heaven as He went up, behold, two men stood by in white apparel; which also said, ye men of Galilee, why stand ye gazing into heaven? This same Jesus which is taken up from you into heaven shall so come in like manner as ye have seen him go into heaven." That was a literal, visible personal ascension of Jesus. This scripture declares that His coming will be in the same manner as was His going away.

In his closing words the evangelist used I Thess. 4:13-18 and made some touching remarks on the joy that will be felt when families can be united and we can meet departed ones again.

A call was made and several stood up, signifying their acceptance of Christ as their Saviour. Pastor Rhoads feels much encouraged as he sees the interest growing and the response to the exhortations given.
