PARTISANSHIP AND THE PACK.

WE have often wondered, during the past six months, what is really behind political partisanship. What human trait is it, that arouses otherwise fair minded and kind hearted men to such malicious and pitiless extremes.

Take the case of President Wilson for example. The president has been for several months a very sick man. Regardless of whether one approves either of the man or his policies, it would seem that under the circumstances a certain human sympathy might creep into even intensely antagonistic political relations.

But there has been no indication of the slightest deviation in feeling or change in tactics toward the president since his collapse and perhaps the president is the last man in the world to ask that there should be.

Nevertheless the inhumanity, the unnatural and needless brutality of the whole business, has we believe impressed thousands of peoples of both parties, who either because of temperament or environment, have never taken an active part in the partisan game, and don't respond to its reactions.

In conversation the other day with a good republican friend of ours—a fine citizen and good sort in every way—we were amazed to find the intensity of hatred which even the name of the president inspired, and he proceeded to say things—personal, gossipy, foolish, silly things, which he sincerely believed and which to us seemed worthy of contempt from the serious historian, or a laugh from the same, fair-minded man of affairs.

And what we asked, had twisted that man's head? He was talking about President Wilson, precisely as others used to talk about President Roosevelt, and of course time would cure and mortify him in one case as it did there in the other, and yet he was undoubtedly reflecting what hundreds of thousands of intense partisans like himself felt, and said, and there was no help for him at least until after election.

Of course its partisanship—the competitive passion overwhelming the judgment,—but what is partisanship?

We asked a wise person this question recently and he replied "Partisanship? that's merely the pack instinct of the jungle, applied to a civilization in which it has no organic place."

Sounds rather high brow, but the more we considered it, the more it seemed to explain the situation.

CHICAGO RESERVE BANK INCREASES DISCOUNT RATE

CHICAGO, Jan. 15.—The Chicago Federal Reserve bank has announced an increase in its discount rate on treasury certificates of indebtedness from 4 1/2 to 4 3/4 per cent.
