JACKSON COUNTY WILL BE PRODUCING OIL WITHIN 12 MONTHS DECLARES EXPERT

The great tomorrow! That was the theme of the closing address at the oil mass meeting at the Page theatre last night given by Professor Vining of Ashland and it struck the keynote of the occasion. Rogue River valley has had its gold tomorrow, its orchard land tomorrow, now will it have its oil tomorrow?

The answer is up to the people of Medford and the Rogue River valley. As Mayor C. E. Gates explained in the opening speech this oil proposition is not for the man who wants to get rich quick or wants something for nothing. Neither is it for the man who can't afford to take a chance and

risk a few hundred dollars without jeopardizing his meal ticket. It is primarily for those who believe in the Rogue River valley, who believe there is a good chance of finding oil in the valley, and who are willing to do their share in determining once and for all whether there is oil, or merely oily talk.

'I have heard off talk ever since I came here eight years ago' said the mayor, 'now let's set about and show this talk up. If we strike oil, well and good,—if we don't strike oil, well and good again,—we can devote our energies and money in other directions. But let's go at this thing right and go to the bottom. To know oil is here will mean millions to us, to know it isn't here will be worth every cent we need to put in to find out.'

H. C. Garnett gave one of his characteristically amusing speeches, admitting he had never even ridden thru an oil country unless the Rogue River valley was one, and didn't pretend to know anything about oil, but he had enough faith in the valley and the Trigonina company to put in his share and thought other public spirited citizens of the valley should do so. 'This is a gambling chance' said Shorty, 'and it's worth taking a chance. If we strike oil and someone comes to me and asks to get in on the ground floor,—I won't be in. No sir. Now is the time to get in, and the vultures on the fence can stay out.'

Probably the most interesting part of the meeting was provided by Attorney P. J. Neff, who read letters from the two oil geologists giving their official reports on the oil possibilities in the valley. The letter from P. C. Dressel follows:

Geologist's Report

To Whom It May Concern: I, the undersigned, have made geological examination of the Trigonina Oil company's lease holdings in Jackson county, Oregon, and other localities in Jackson county. I wish to state that in my opinion the Trigonina company has made a very excellent selection as to drilling site, and if you drill on the selected location you have every chance in the world to get a large producer. The anticlinal structure is of sufficient size to warrant me to predict a gusher well.

The geological description of the sedimentary beds left intact in this section of Jackson county is of the Cretaceous and Tertiary age, the fossiliferous classification being the Trigonina from which your company takes its name.

In passing over your holdings there is an anticline on the face of a hill above the Chadwick ranch of which the northwesterly side, has partly eroded away which will give to the layman as well as geologist an ideal picture of a plunging anticlinal structure, which is of sufficient size to warrant an opinion as a large petroleum structural receptacle built by nature's hands at the time the Siskiyou uplift occurred.

I have made numerous qualitative tests of the shales and sandstones and find them to carry paraffin and petroleum residue. A theory that has been advanced by some people that the petroleum substances have been burned out of the formation. I wish to contradict these opinions, from the standpoint that all of the hydrocarbons are intact, as can be seen in the coal-bearing strata thru-out the country where the ancient sedimentary beds are found. I have had the pleasure of accompanying Mr. E. W. Liljegan of Medford, Ore., and checking up the geological survey made by Mr. N. L. Josey of California, and find the structural dips, angles and strikes to be in exact conformity with his geological map of the Trigonina Oil company's holdings and I consider Mr. Josey's geological report very conservative. I base my opinion of this district on the ground that I have been a geological student for the last twenty years and have visited practically all of the oil fields of the United States and Mexico, and have operated in some of the fields. To the officers of the Trigonina company I give my permission to use my report in any way they may see fit.

I truly believe that Jackson county will be producing oil inside of the next twelve months.

Mr. Neff also read an equally optimistic report from the well known oil geologist, N. L. Josey, and a hearty boost for the project from Colonel E. E. Kelly who is now busy in the oil fields of Wichita Falls, Texas.

The audience was attentive thru-out and it was apparent the program had impressed everyone present that the chances of striking oil in the valley are really excellent and the project worthy of enthusiastic support.

PACIFIC HIGHWAY TO BE DEDICATED 1920

The Pacific highway will be formally dedicated its full length from the Canadian border to the Mexican boundary September 30, said Samuel Hill, president of the Pacific Highway association in Portland today. 'The highway can now be traveled from the Mexican line to Central Point, Ore., and by September it will

be in good condition to La Center, Wash. I am now going to Seattle to get assurance that the Washington gap from La Center to Olympia will be finished this year.'

Three formal exercises will mark the dedication of the highway. One of these will be at Blaine, Wash., one at the interstate bridge across the Columbia and one in San Francisco. —Portland Journal, Jan. 20.
