MAJOR D. R. ANDRUS FUNERAL HELD IN CITY SUNDAY AT 2

The funeral services over the remains of the late Dwight R. Andrus of this city, who passed away at Roseburg, Ore., Jan. 22, at 1 a. m., will be held at the Weeks & McGowan chapel, Sunday afternoon at 2 o'clock. The Rev. J. Randolph Sannett of the First Methodist Episcopal church will conduct the services, assisted by the G. A. R.

The deceased, known among his many friends as Major Andrus, was born July 23, 1844, Washington, Macomb county, Michigan, and spent the early part of his life there.

He was a veteran of the Civil war and enlisted Aug. 8, 1862, from Macomb county, Michigan, for three years, and was mustered into the United States service August 14, 1862, at Pontiac, Mich., as a bugler in Company B, 22nd Michigan Infantry Volunteers, under Alonzo M. Keeler and Colonel Moses Wisner.

Although mustered in as a bugler, he carried a gun from the first, and was in all the engagements of his regiment up to the battle of Nashville, Tenn., Dec. 15, 1864, when he was on detail as clerk at General Thomas' headquarters.

At Chickamauga, Ga., he received a slight flesh wound across the fingers of his right hand, and was captured that day, Sept. 19, 1863, but escaped from his captors during the night.

The 22nd regiment left the state for Lexington, Kentucky. Moving to Georgia, it participated at Chickamauga, where, after fighting for three hours, exhausting its ammunition, it charged into overwhelming numbers with the bayonet, driving the enemy back until overcome by too great a force, when most of the number were taken prisoners. It later participated in the movement toward Atlanta. On April 1, 1865, it was attached to the 3rd brigade, separate division Army of the Cumberland.

Comrade Andrus received his final discharge July 26, 1865, at Detroit, Michigan. He served from 1867 to 1870 as a member of Captain George H. West's company, Colorado militia, which after its organization at Golden, Col., was mustered into the Colorado state militia.

His father served in the Toledo war over the boundary between Ohio and Michigan; his grandfather in the war of 1812, and his great grandfather in the revolution.

He was a member of Macomb Lodge No. 64, A. P. & A. M. of Davis Michigan, and Chester A. Arthur Post No. 47, Dept. of Oregon, Grand Army of the Republic, and at the time of his death was commander of the Southern Oregon Soldiers and Sailors' association. He was deputy sheriff of Sonoma county, California, and constable of Salt Point township in the same county, and was head of police at Tehuac, Cal., at different times. He followed mining thruout Colorado, California and Oregon, coming to Medford in the early nineties, since which time he has resided here. In 1902 he was united in marriage to Mrs. Sarah M. Whitman of this city.

He is survived by his wife, three sisters, and one brother; Sarah M. Andrus of this city, Miss Agnes Andrus and Mrs. Nancy Scanton of Detroit, Mich.; Mrs. Mary DeLano of New York City, and Frank D. Andrus of Detroit, Mich.
