MINNEAPOLIS, Jan. 31.—Flour prices have varied only slightly here during January, it was learned today. Early in the month flour advanced a quarter a barrel but in January it dropped fifty cents remaining at \$14.25 since, according to quotations at the leading mills here.

Corn Advances
CHICAGO, Jan. 31.—Advances in the price of corn took place today owing more or less to reports from Washington of a prospective reduction in cultivated acreage as a consequence of dissatisfaction on the part of farmers. Continue attention was given to the smallness of supplies at primary centers, the outcome of inability of railroads to move grain promptly. Opening prices which ranged from 34c to 34 1/2c higher with May \$1.36 to \$1.36 1/2, and July \$1.32 1/2 to \$1.32 3/4 were maintained.
