Mr. Lee was always ready and willing to help any one; his word was as good as his bond. His friends spoke of him as Honest Lee. He would give his last dollar to any one he thought was in need. He always had a good word and pleasant smile for every one. His body was laid to rest in the Rock Point cemetery Saturday afternoon, January 31, and while he has no relatives on this coast, his loved ones many friends to mourn his loss.

Two years ago last summer, when her husband, Captain Malone of the First company, Coast artillery, entered the service, Mrs. Malone and children accompanied him to the north where

they lived near the army camps during the period of her husband's service. On the latter's discharge from the army they came to Medford where they have resided for the past year. Mrs. Malone is survived by her husband and two young sons, aged 8 and 4.
