OIL INTERESTS GROWING IN VALLEY: STOCK SELLING FAST; TO DRILL TWENTY WELLS SOON

Medford and the Rogue River valley is not yet oil crazy, but is exceedingly oil interested, and the oil developments now going on and being planned leads most everyone to not only talk and think oil, but to invest a goodly amount of their savings in local oil stock. The craze is not to come, most everyone agrees—that will appear with the first oil well.

At present the interest is so great that local people are drinking oily drinks, eating greasy foods and oiling their hair, except George T. Collins, Jonas Wold, Bill Smith and a few other citizens who nevertheless are oil enthusiasts.

There are now not less than four distinct oil companies with extensive leases, and rumors of more coming, two of which are preparing to drill, and the prediction is confidently made by many that inside of six months or a year at the most not less than 20 wells will be in process of drilling. The great possibilities of oil in the valley and the oil activities here attract much attention all over Oregon and in other states.

Oil Optimism Prevails. This interest in oil really started several months ago when the Trigonia Oil company was organized by well known Medford men and began to interest and educate the public with its clean and straightforward propaganda. At first most people were a little skeptical then ignorance on the subject, but gradually skepticism grew to optimism and then as expert opinion piled up from unquestioned authorities who had examined the land formation and strata general confidence began to be felt.

Prior to the formation of the Trigonia company Colonel J. F. Mundy and associates began drilling a well, but work was discontinued because of various hindrances, but work on the well, which is down to a depth of over 400 feet, will soon be resumed. No stock in or has been for sale by this company and its promoters while having every confidence in the world, are close mouthed as to the company's activities.

Trigonia Company Outlook. Things look better every day with the Trigonia company which has its derrick, tools and equipment except the required amount of casing on the ground one mile east of Phoenix on the Ferns ranch where it will soon begin drilling its first well. Hundreds of Medford and valley people have

already purchased stock in this company and more are coming the daily. Not less than \$500 worth of stock is being purchased daily in the company's office in the main block, in blocks of from \$2 and up to \$50 and \$100.

Women Purchasing Stock. Among several conservative men who each took \$100 worth of stock yesterday was one of the best known and most conservative men of the valley. Four more women purchased stock yesterday. The interest displayed by the women of this city and valley is an interesting feature of the situation, in all those that 20 women have so far made stock purchases.

The Trigonia company has for some time had the money to sink its first well. The delay in actually beginning work is due to the inability to get a sufficient amount of well casing to insure completion of the well when work is started. The company will not begin drilling until it has 3000 feet of casing and the casing quantities obtained from various parts of the country, in an order for from 2000 to 3000 feet of casing, which he was having shipped to San Francisco where it will be threaded before being shipped to Medford. The company in addition now has a car-load of casing awaiting in Portland for shipment to Medford, and has agents out all over the country.

Soon Ready to Drill. Already the Trigonia company has much casing with the other drilling equipment on the ground, and yesterday Frank Ross, the company's field man, telegraphed Capt. S. S. Francisco that he had had 1000 feet of casing, which he was having shipped to San Francisco where it will be threaded before being shipped to Medford. The company in addition now has a car-load of casing awaiting in Portland for shipment to Medford, and has agents out all over the country.

GOLD AND SILVER EXPORTS FROM U.S. GO TO FAR EAST

WASHINGTON, Feb. 11.—South America and the Far East absorbed the bulk of the exports of gold and silver from the United States during the year 1919, the department of commerce announced today.

Japan, China and Argentina received the greatest part of the gold sent out of the country and China and India the major portion of silver exports.

Of the total gold exports in 1919 which amounted to \$285,185,248, Japan took \$94,114,189, China, including Hong Kong, \$70,295,738 and Argentina \$46,569,999. Shipments of silk and tea from Japan, silk and vegetable oils from China and beef and hides from Argentina to the United States heavily overbalanced American exports of manufactured goods.

Silver sent out of the country during 1919 totaled \$229,021,991, of which India received \$169,150,716 and China, including Hong Kong, \$87,828,714. This demand, officials explained, was due to the extensive use of silver coins as ornaments in India and the silver standard in China.
