

### NOTED ORATOR AT LINCOLN BANQUET TOMORROW NIGHT

The address on Lincoln, which is one of the principal features of the annual Lincoln day banquet at the Hotel Medford tomorrow night, will be delivered this year by one of the country's foremost platform men—Bishop Matthew Simpson Hughes.

As a churchman Bishop Hughes has made a most remarkable record. He has commanded some of the leading churches of the Methodist Episcopal denomination. And even though he had a brother already in the episco-

Bishop Hughes is not only a church man, he is a statesman. His services have been much in demand for political addresses. On these occasions his manifest insight into political problems has often brought forth the remark that had he not entered the ministry he would doubtless have been one of the country's foremost statesmen.

To the people of Medford Bishop Hughes does not come as a stranger. His public address delivered before a large crowd in the park last summer is still a memorable occasion to all who heard him. In accepting the invitation to deliver the Lincoln address tomorrow night the bishop wrote, saying: "It will rush me from the east, but both the theme and the occasion beguile me."

This distinguished visitor will be warmly received by a host of admirers. Everything is in readiness for the annual Lincoln day club banquet at the Medford Hotel tomorrow evening beginning at 8 p. m. sharp. The program will be very interesting and the attendance promises to be large. If you haven't your ticket secure it early tomorrow from Glen Taylor, or any other republican, or at the Chamber of Commerce, or Medford hotel. Do not wait until evening. There will be a big delegation from Ashland and attendance from all over the county and up state.

The ladies will be very much in evidence in the coming campaign and are urged to be present at the banquet. The banquet at Medford is recognized as the opening gun of the republican primary campaign in Oregon.

Colonel Washburn's speech on the political situation is proving a drawing card and will be well worth the price of a plate. Bishop Hughes' talk on Lincoln, and Prof. Vining's talk on Roosevelt will both be gems, while the other part of the program, including the banquet, will be first class.

### ARLOINE SCUTTI CONCERT CHARMS GOOD AUDIENCE

The long anticipated Arloine Andrews-Scutti concert took place last evening at the First Presbyterian church, and proved a decided treat for music lovers of Medford.

Mrs. Scutti is truly an artist. She is a daughter of George Andrews of this city, whose family were members of the famous Andrews Opera Co. who have long held an enviable reputation in musical circles throughout the country.

Mrs. Scutti's voice is a rich colorful contralto, of splendid depth and range, and her interpretations were given with such ease and dramatic power that with her initial song the audience was captivated.

In Mrs. Scutti's voice is volume, flexibility, and much sweetness, while in her lower range she displays rich tones of pathos and dramatic fire. Her technique is faultless, and wonderful light and color is also characteristic. In addition to her charming voice Mrs. Scutti is also possessed of unusual personal magnetism, and it is hoped that Medford will soon have an opportunity of hearing this talented artist again.

Under the very capable direction of Mrs. George Andrews a women's chorus of twenty-five voices was heard in four pleasing numbers. Faithful training is evident. Much volume, sweetness, precision and shading is a feature of their work.

Habanera, from Carmen, with Mrs. Scutti and the chorus was warmly applauded, as was also the Prayer by Moussorgsky.

Among Mrs. Scutti's songs Del Rio's Happy Song, Kashmiria Song from Indian Love Lyrics, and the Aria from Sampson and Delilah were received with greatest favor.

Mrs. Flora Gray accompanied the chorus on both the organ and piano in a capable manner. Another num-

ber calling forth much praise was the Aria, from Mignon with a pleasing violin obligato by Carleton James. Throughout the program Mrs. Andrews who accompanied Mrs. Scutti at the piano gave a most finished and sympathetic performance. Following is the program:

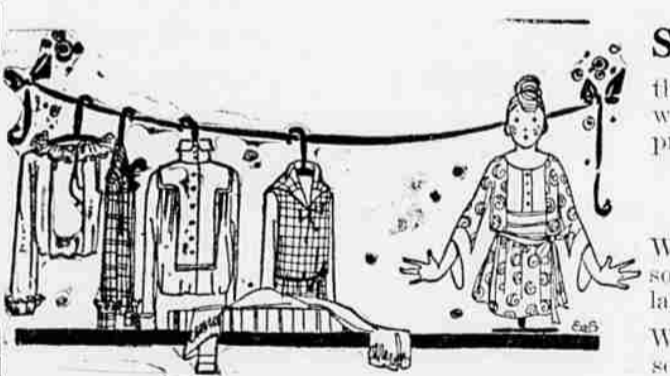
