

### SPORTSMEN MUST GET IN LINE SAYS CARL SHOEMAKER

"It is up to the sportsmen in this section to work in harmony with the state fish and game commission or expect to receive little consideration from them," was the statement of Carl D. Shoemaker, state game warden, who was here today to meet friends and explain the controversy which arose just prior to the special session of the legislature, says the Roseburg Review.

Mr. Shoemaker has been to most of the points in southern Oregon, where he has endeavored to smooth over the soreness felt by the sportsmen's element and is expected to leave for the north tonight. Mr. Shoemaker says the old commission is still holding meetings and doing business but will merge with the new commission of which it is a part on March 1. He declares that the reason for "fining" State Biologist Finley was because he was a consistent opponent to the commission.

Mr. Shoemaker today made a statement as follows: "The controversy in regard to the fish and game commission has been settled. The auditor appointed by Governor Olcott last June to go over the books and ascertain the facts in regard to the charges made by a small coterie of sportsmen has completed his work and has found that the accounts of the fish and game commission are correct, that no game money has been used to propagate salmon and that in all other respects the work of the commission has been carried on successfully and honestly."

"The commission bears no malice toward any of those sportsmen or organizations which preferred the charges," continued the warden. "We want the great work of game conservation to go on. It cannot go forward and achieve the best results unless the sportsmen and their organizations are willing to help. I appeal to all good sportsmen now to come forward and cooperate with the commission."

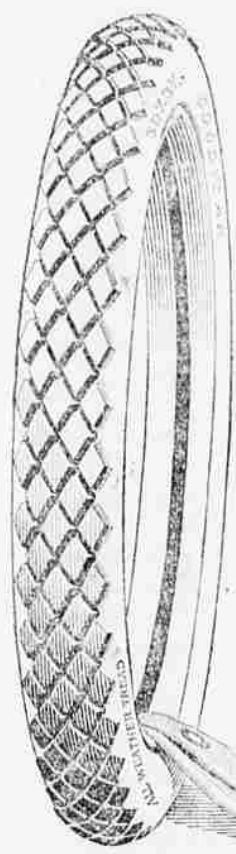
### TRY TO RAISE \$35,000 FOR OLD HOME CHARITY

The feeling has arisen that the people owe them some consideration, and the situation has reached such a point that many of these worthy Oregonians, bereft of enough to care for their actual needs in the fall of life, are actually without a place to lay their heads. Present day conditions of high living costs have led to aggravate this situation to a great extent, until at the present time Oregon finds itself confronted by a real problem.
