Sounds suspicious. But it isn't. Every resident of Jackson county will have a chance to get 100 percent interest in one year, by voting for the \$500,000 good road bond issue, this May.

For this bond issue as fentatively arranged will be expended on only one condition, that every dollar spent by the county be matched by a dollar spent by the federal government. If neither the state nor government come through then Jackson county wont. ment come through then Jackson county wont.

That's fair, isn't it,—and also profitable. The value of the Pacific highway has sufficiently demonstrated the value of good roads to render any of the hackneyed arguivents unnecessary. No one questions the value of good roads any more,—the only problem is to pay for them.
