

ELKS TO BUILD ADDITION TO CLUB HOUSE; ALENDERFER IS ELECTED EXALTED RULER

The Elks lodge at the annual meeting last night in addition to electing officers for the ensuing year, voted to purchase the fifty-foot lot adjoining the Elks temple on which they will build a structure at a probable cost of \$7000 to enlarge the club quarters, and decided to enlist the State Elks association at its annual meeting at Salem next June to take steps to cooperate with the government to save the fast decreasing Elk herds of the Jackson Hole country from extinction.

O. O. Alenderfer is the new exalted ruler of the lodge, and in choosing him the members decided to switch from the nude cranium style of beauty in vogue the past year to the partially Elks still has a couple of hundred hairs left.

The Elks, which the past year during the administration of George T. Collins enjoyed a wonderfully prosperous and growing condition, under the leadership of Mr. Alenderfer look forward to at least a continuation of this and a better record, if that were possible. Two hundred new members were admitted during the 13 months past and much property and improvements were accumulated by the lodge.

Alenderfer an Able Elk
The new exalted ruler is one of the original members of the lodge and has for years been one of its hardest workers and ablest members. He earns his livelihood by assisting Harry Walther in enlightening the people of Medford and the valley. More power to him. He is of the quiet, conservative type, but is full of fire and energy, as one can easily learn by stepping on one of his horns. In handsomeness he does not stand out conspicuously over the ex-

alted rulers of several years past, but at that he is good to look at—thru smoked glasses and because of the soul within him.

There was a very large attendance of members from all parts of the valley and the hill districts at last night's meeting. The election passed off without excitement and with despatch. Two offices only were really contested for.

The Newly Elected Officers
The following officers were elected: Exalted ruler, O. O. Alenderfer; esteemed leading knight, Rawley Moore; esteemed loyal knight, Geo. Hilton, Jr.; esteemed lecturing knight Frank Farrell; secretary, Lee L. Jacobs; treasurer, V. H. Vawter; tiler, J. H. Henselman; trustee (three-year term), Glenn O. Taylor; representative to grand lodge, Geo. T. Collins; alternate representative to grand lodge, J. J. Buchter.

The veteran able secretary, Lee L. Jacobs, who was here when the Lewis and Clark expedition passed thru the valley hunting the Columbia river, was of course re-elected, as was Vernon Vawter and John H. Henselman.

New Club Building Planned
The proposition to purchase the 50-foot lot adjoining the Elks temple on the north for \$2000 was unanimously passed. An option had been previously obtained on the lot from Mrs. Hull, its owner, as the lodge is growing so fast and its club and dining room features have become so popular that room is needed for expansion. Plans now on foot contemplate the construction of an additional club building at a probable cost of \$5000 to \$7000, which will house the Elks restaurant and other club features.

The subject of the B. P. O. E. of the United States taking steps to protect the Elk herds of the Jackson Hole country was brought up by Lewis Ulrich, and he was ably seconded by Alex Sparrow, and C. A. Winetrot of Grants Pass. These men were appointed a committee to bring the matter before the state Elks association at Salem.

John Brown's Method
"And the way in which John Brown avoided the anti-climax proposed by his friends and attorneys pleading insanity and swung sympathy to his cause.

"If interested I will be glad to send it and other John Brown books to you."
"Now the two cases, Lovejoy, who died defending himself and John Brown, who boldly faced the issue and was convicted, had tremendous historical sequences which no jury should lightly wish to assume.

Oratorical Possibilities
"It strikes me there are some most interesting legal as well as oratorical possibilities along this line—i. e., could not one or two others involved, as a soldiers' attempt to defend their right—perhaps as legally indefensible as John Brown. With Britt Smith defending his home, and all of them actuated by fear for bodily harm from threats. And Elmer Smith and the others not cognizant of any but strictly defensive war measures. And while evidently Warren Grimm was not this time involved in the raiding, the western law of reaching for a gun or motions like it, should apply.

"And surely here is a case for constructive murder indictments for the casual connection is positive, and logical reaching to the Commercial Club.

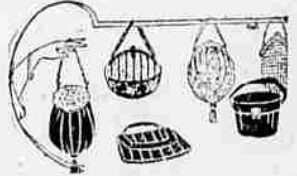

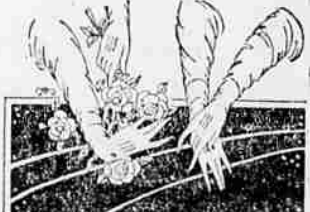
