

### ADVISES OREGON TO "DOLL UP" AS COMPANY'S COMIN'

Come, let us "doll up," put on our best clothes for company is coming, more company than we have ever entertained before. We must look our best and prettiest for we want our friends to see us at our best and to go away pleased with their visit.

This is the message the secretary of the Pacific Northwest Tourist association, Herbert Cuthbert, sends to all the communities in the Pacific northwest. He anticipates for this year, from the information in his office, the greatest tourist travel we have ever seen, both by rail and automobile. He says that during a trip by rail thru various sections of the Pacific northwest, taken recently, that he noticed a great many of our beauty spots disfigured by broken fences, burnt, fallen and dead timber, and urges all the communities to endeavor to get the owners to clean these places up. He would remind us of the annual proclamation issued by the governor for a clean-up week, wherein our vacant lots should be cleared of all debris, flower seeds planted where possible, fences repaired, houses and barns painted and everything done so that when this flock of tourists come upon us everything unsightly will have disappeared.

The value of the tourist travel to each community will depend upon

the community itself. The people stay longest where they are comfortably housed, well fed, entertained and amused, and where the attractions are most favorably brought to their notice, where camping grounds are provided and the facilities and conveniences are adequate.

### MEXICAN MINE BURNS, 136 DEAD REPORTED

MEXICO CITY, Mar. 11.—One hundred and thirty-six miners have not been accounted for in the El Bodro mine at Pachuca, a mining city near Mexico City in the state of Hidalgo, where fire broke out this morning, according to telephone advices from Pachuca.

Two hundred and four of the 340 men working in the shaft where the flames are raging have been accounted for. It is not known whether the remainder escaped through adjoining shafts or perished, as the heat from the flames is making rescue work impossible.

WASHINGTON, Mar. 11.—A wireless news service to Porto Rico is planned by the navy department if congress approves legislation authorizing the use of the naval radio service for commercial and press messages. Rear Admiral Bullard, in charge of naval communication, today told the house merchant marine committee.

"Porto Rico does not know what is doing in this country," declared the admiral, "and we should let them read American news. The island is now served with foreign news. The first thing we know we might have a state of unrest down there."

WASHINGTON, Mar. 11.—Labor's nominations to the railroad labor board, the wage board of appeals on which the public will have representation, were submitted today to the president. There were ten names from which the president will select three to be sent to the senate for confirmation along with the three from the railroad executives and three representing the public. The railroad executives have not yet completed their list nor has the president selected the public group.

NEW YORK, Mar. 11.—A suit to recover \$2218 alleged to have been lost because of an error by the Dow Jones and Company news ticker service in reporting the decision of the United States supreme court in the Macomber case in which the court held that stock dividends are not taxable as income was filed here today against Joseph Cashman, as treasurer of the company, by Gaston Jalliot, Martin C. Anson, attorney for Jalliot, declared the case is a test suit filed in the interests of other clients, some of whom "were ruined."

### BIG SILVER-GOLD STRIKE IN ALASKA

JUNEAU, Alaska—Here, Alaska, on the Kenai Peninsula, has been the scene of a silver-gold strike that promises to develop considerable importance, according to word reaching Juneau recently. The vein is said to be a six-foot one, carrying values estimated at \$77 a ton, the report said. A three-inch stringer, it was said, assayed \$300 to the ton.

### DISTILLATE DROUGHT HITS ALASKA FLEET

SEWARD, Alaska—Alaska's motley fishing fleets will be hit hard, fishermen say, by a recent decision of oil companies to withdraw distillate from the market.

Many of the fishing boats, it has been estimated, will be obliged to spend approximately \$1,500 or \$1,750 more a year for gasoline than they did for distillate.

Practically every one of the scores of fishing boats operating in Alaska waters has been using distillate. Many of the boats are equipped with fifty horse power engines and use about five gallons of distillate an hour.

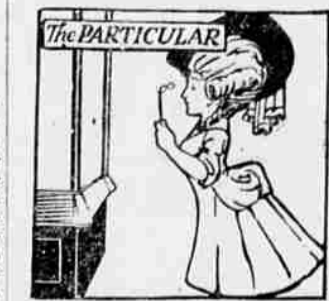

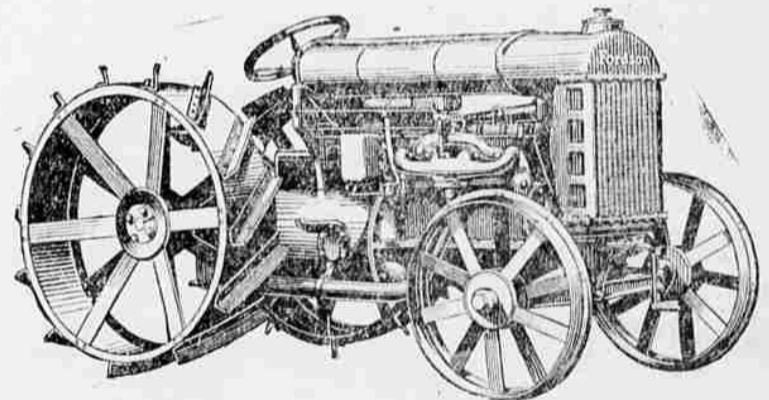
