

CHAMBER OF COMMERCE CAN DO WHATEVER CITY'S REQUIREMENTS DICTATE

The Mail Tribune presents the answer to the second of the five questions most often asked in relation to the expansion and reorganization of the Chamber of Commerce—What can the Chamber of Commerce do?

The first question answered in yesterday's issue was why there should be such an organization here. The three other questions which cover other phases of the campaign and answers to which will be made this week, are as to how the chamber will be financed, who will run it and its outlook for permanency.

Answering the second of the five questions most often asked in relation to the expansion and reorganization of the Chamber of Commerce, "What can the Chamber of Commerce do," a member of the committee makes the statement below. The first question, answered in the Mail Tribune Monday, was why there should be such an organization here. The three other questions which cover other phases of the campaign next week, and answers to which will be made this week, are as to how the chamber will be financed, who will run it and its outlook for permanency.

What can the Medford Chamber of Commerce do?
It can do anything upon which the thought and energy of the community have been centered as needful to be done.

What it will do depends entirely upon the membership. Every member will have an equal voice in saying what it should do, and the doing of those things will then become a matter of uniting the whole chamber to that end.

Putting the question another way, suppose it is asked: Who is going to say what the Chamber of Commerce shall do? The president? No. The directors? No. The committees? No. The members? Yes.

The manner in which the members will do this is one of the most important features of the expanded Chamber of Commerce a feature on which is based one of the chief appeals for the support and cooperation of 100 or more of the business and profes-

The run of salmon will not start until about April 1st, altho reports, which Mr. Bailey is inclined to disbelieve, have reached the city that several salmon have been seen in the lower river in the vicinity of Grants Pass. The river is higher now following the recent rains and snows.

ROVING MARINES GIVE FREE SHOW AT PAGE TONIGHT

Last night a party of seventy Marines with Captain Charles T. Brooks in charge, arrived in Medford.

With the party is the famous Mare Island Marine Band, noted to be the best military band on the west coast. It consists of 24 pieces and is under the capable leadership of first sergeant Cunningham.

The remainder of the party is made up of entertainers consisting of a quartette, saxophone quartette, an Jewish monologist, jugglers, jugglers, acrobats, and comedians. Also in the show there are two reels of motion pictures illustrating the life of a marine at work and play. While in Los Angeles several hundred feet of film was made when the party visited the Fairbanks Studios. In this picture Douglas Fairbanks, Charlie Chaplin, Jack Dempsey, Jim Corbett and Kid McVey joined the marines in an hour of play and amusement. Chaplin and Fairbanks outdo themselves in laughable stunts.

The marines will be here two days. They gave a street parade today at 2:00 p. m., and a band concert at 2:30. While here their show will be put on at the Page theatre and it is hoped that everyone will avail themselves of the opportunity to see this first class performance. The admission is free and although it is being advertised as a "smoker" the ladies are invited. It is a clean show and it is hoped that the women will turn out to see it.

February 1, this year, three marine parties were started out by orders from the marine corps headquarters, Washington, D. C., to tour the Eastern, Central and Western parts of the United States, simultaneously. The party to be in Medford was organized in Mare Island, California. They put on their first show in Oakland, thence traveled south through San Francisco, San Jose, Los Angeles, El Centro, Yuma, and Tucson and as far east as El Paso, Texas.

After leaving El Paso, they are on their way back through Arizona and after stopping at Bakersfield, Visalia, Fresno, Stockton and Sacramento they leave sunny Cal. for a tour in the Northwest.

In every city so far visited the Roving Marines have been well received and the party has proved an unqualified success.

The purpose of the party is to allow the public to judge what sort of men the grand old corps has in its ranks.

The marine corps is doing its best to turn out men at the close of their enlistment who are qualified to meet life's battles with success. If the public understands this they will not discourage young men from entering the service. The "Roving Marines" are endeavoring to emphasize this point.

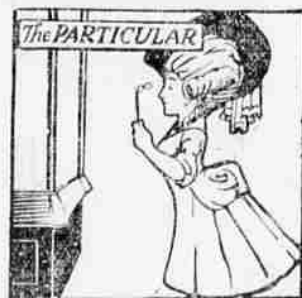
