MEMBERSHIP OF CAMPAIGN TEAMS IS MADE PUBLIC

The final details incident to the beginning of the membership drive in the Chamber of Commerce expansion and reorganization campaign are rapidly being disposed of, and there will be no delay in the teams getting down to the enrollment work Tuesday morning. This statement was authorized today at campaign headquarters following a meeting held yesterday between the majors and team captains.

The team captains selected from the available service pledge cards the names of the men who are to constitute their respective teams. From the sixty signed workers cards each of the ten captains selected six men who will work with him and for him. As the teams are to have at least a captain and seven workers it will be necessary for each of the captains to sign up an additional worker.

Captain John Carlin of Major Sheldon's division was the first to turn in his full quota of team workers, and the others are expected to do so today.

Meeting Friday 7:30

Majors and captains have been called to meet at headquarters Friday evening at 7:30 o'clock at which time Director James E. Green will deliver a "sales talk" and answer all questions and explain how the teams are to proceed when they take the field next week. A letter is being sent out to all team members advising them of their assignments to the different teams, and calling their attention to the importance of the meeting Friday evening.

Teams are not limited to seven men and a captain, but as many available workers as are possible to secure to assist in the canvass may be pressed into service. The fact has been made plain that the more workers there are in the field the fewer prospects each will be required to call on, and, naturally, the grand total of enrollments will be correspondingly benefited. The teams will meet at campaign headquarters at 9:45 a. m., Tuesday morning to be photographed in a group at 10 a. m., at the public library. Immediately after the picture has been made the workers will set out on their canvass for 400 members and that portion of the budget which will not have been secured. Efforts are being made to have as much of the budget subscribed as possible before the drive for members starts. At 12 o'clock noon all of the workers will report for luncheon at the Hotel Holland where the reports of the day's work will be tabulated on a blackboard. Singing and short speeches will be a feature. This program will be continued Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, except that on the last two days the luncheon will be held at the Hotel Medford.

Each of the division majors is planning to hold a secret conference with his captains and their team workers at some time between now and Tuesday morning to devise the necessary ways and means of "showing up" the opposing division. It should be understood, by this, that the only "opposition" that will develop will be in the friendly rivalry growing out of the desire of each to sign up a greater number of members than the other.

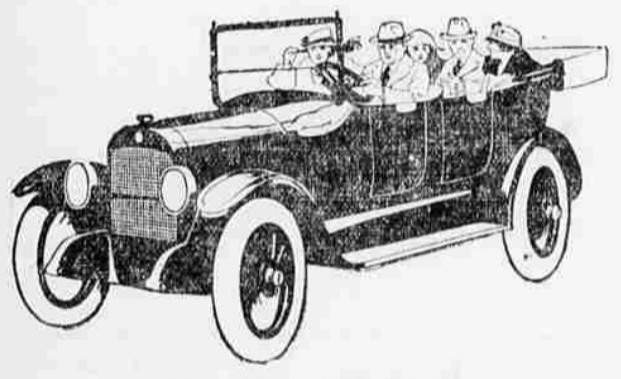
