## WILL MOVE FOR NEW TRIAL IN THE EVANS CASE

Lark Evans, who was found guilty early Saturday evening by the jury in great court of the robbery of W. G. White of Grants Pass last September, will be sentenced by Judge Callahan tomorrow morning. The maximum sentence is 20 years in the penitentiary. Evans is out in the meantime on \$1000 bond, which was furnished by his father after the jury's verdict was given.

Through his attorney, Gus Newberry, he will move for a new trial. Mr. Newberry says he is absolutely convinced of Evans' innocence of the crime charged, otherwise he would drop all efforts in his defense with the jury verdict and that hence he will do his utmost to save him from the penitentiary.

The case was one of the most interesting and hard fought in the county's history, and in view of the conflicting evidence County Prosecutor Roberts is being congratulated on all sides for his victory for the state. His cross examination of the witnesses for the defense as to the seemingly strong alibi, and his arguments to the jury were very effective.

From the time of Evans' first arrest Sheriff Terrell and Prosecutor Roberts, despite the strong alibi, fell sure of Evans' guilt and worked hard in accord. The sheriff, especially, stuck on to his theory like a bull dog, spending much time and money in investigating all angles and in seeking new evidence.
