An important sale of business property on Main street has just been transacted by which Samuel T. Richardson becomes the owner of the west half of the Miles building at 129 East Main st., adjoining the First National bank building, the lower floor of which is occupied by the Model Clothing company store and the upper floor by the Klein Tailoring establishment.

The building is only 25 feet wide and 70 feet long, although the lot on which it stands is 140 feet deep. Mr. Richardson intends to eventually extend the building to the full depth of the lot.
