

### HOLLAND HOTEL TO BUILD ON A BIG ADDITION

Now along with Medford's growth in prosperity and progress, and the rumor that outside capital is contemplating a very large modern hotel of 250 rooms, comes the announcement by John A. Westerlund, owner, and Carl A. Tengwald, manager of the Hotel Holland that plans are being made to build a large addition to the Holland with a capacity of from 75 to 80 rooms, and with the finest hotel dining room in southern Oregon whose seating capacity will be 250 diners.

The plans call for a concrete and steel fire-proof addition of four floors immediately adjoining the present hotel structure in the rear with a frontage of 100 feet on Sixth street and about the same frontage on North Grape street. To make way for the addition and to permit of the new and old structure to connect as one huge building, the alley in the rear of the Holland, which is privately owned, will be closed and built over.

When the addition is completed and other improvements made the entire lower floor of the present Hotel Holland will be converted into an immense lobby and hotel office.

Messrs. Westerlund and Tengwald have recently been at Portland and other points getting the best ideas to be embodied in the erection of the new building and its amalgamation with the present structure into a large, modern hotel.

### WHY WALTER TOOZE IS FOR GEN. WOOD FOR NOMINATION

The following statement is made by Walter Lincoln Tooze, Sr., of Salem, who is in the city organizing Leonard Wood clubs:

We support Leonard Wood for the presidency because his record in Cuba as governor general and in the Philippines prove him to be one of the most masterly and successful executives of modern times. As governor general of Cuba, he found a country disrupted, disorganized and seething with the curse of yellow fever, with not a public school on the island. Under the power of his aggressive, ceaseless and untiring leadership, the scourge of yellow fever was eradicated not only from Cuba, but from the entire world.

A stable government was firmly established and when his work was finished he left behind him one of the most sanitary and best governed republics on the western hemisphere. Moreover, 275,000 children were attending the public schools of Cuba.

He was almost immediately called for a like duty in the Moro provinces of the Philippines, where for 400 years Spain had fought with the natives to establish at least a semi-civilized government and had failed. Taft was governor general of the Philippines, and Leonard Wood's duty was to establish a civilized and sane government in that country of Malay pirates, slave dealers, Mohammedans and Christians, and he did it after suffering untold privations with his American soldiers. Cuba and Moroland stand as living monuments to the wonderful executive and organizing capacity of General Leonard Wood.

To Leonard Wood and Theodore Roosevelt will, thru all time, be given the credit of preaching the mighty doctrine of preparedness years before the great war and to them this nation owes a debt of gratitude which it can never repay. Let us forget Wood and his two sons were in the late war and ever stood ready to do and die for our beloved country. We are proud that General Wood, who has come up from the ranks, is not only in America but the world over. With the Bolsheviks, anarchists, communists and the I. W. W.'s and kindred organizations running rampant in this nation and threatening the destruction of the American government and the lowering of the American flag, whom do the voters desire for president? Surely not a plumber, an artist, or a school teacher, but a strong man who has proven on the field of action that he is a great executive and a peerless organizer of good government. The election of Leonard Wood means peace and a stable government that will always function.

### ROGUE RIVER FISH BILL CONTROVERSY IS SETTLED

not afford to give the time necessary to investigate and carry to successful termination the prosecution of law violations. The parties hereto agree that they will cause a bill to be introduced at the coming session of the legislature providing for a salary of \$1800 per year for the prosecuting attorney of Curry county.

**Increase Steelhead**

"10. It is the desire of the first party to develop and enlarge the salmon propagation work of the hatchery on the upper river, located at Elk Creek. In this suggestion the parties of the second part are in hearty sympathy and they, and each thereof, do hereby pledge that they will earnestly co-operate with the first party in every reasonable way and manner to bring about such greater development and to assist in the procurement of government and state aid and assistance in working out the problem of developing the said Elk Creek hatchery to the highest possible efficiency. It is the desire of the second parties to continue the restocking and propagation of fish, particularly steelhead, for the Rogue River and its tributaries. The first party is in hearty sympathy with this desire and pledges himself to aid and assist in every reasonable manner to the extent of using the hatchery at Elk Creek so that the steelhead may be propagated and developed at that point. This co-operation in regard to the game fish, including steelheads, shall not be limited to the Elk Creek hatchery, but the first party pledges himself to aid in every reasonable manner to the restocking of the Rogue River and its tributaries.

"11. In so far as the Rogue River and its tributaries are concerned the steelhead shall be considered and classified under the law as trout.

**Bill to be Introduced**

"12. The second parties agree to introduce into the next legislature, being the session of 1921, a bill embodying the terms and conditions of this contract and each and all of the parties hereto agree that they will support and recommend to the said legislature of Oregon that the said bill be enacted into law so that this contract and agreement may be of legal force and effect in each and all of its provisions.

"13. This agreement shall be executed by the presidents and secretaries of the parties of the second part and indorsed by the Multnomah Anglers Club, the Portland Chamber of Commerce, the Oregon Sportsman's League, the Hoteliers' association of the state of Oregon and by other organizations of a kindred nature.

**Appoint Committee**

"14. Should any condition, legal or otherwise arise that would prevent the herein agreed regulation of fishing or the contemplated legislation that the same shall operate as a release to the parties or either thereof.

"15. This agreement is a compromise of the differences of the parties adopted with a spirit of fairness and with an earnest and sincere pledge on the part of all the signatories hereto that every effort will be made in such spirit to work out the problems of each other to the end that commercial fishing may be continued in the Rogue River and at the same time the hook and line fishing may be saved to the upper river.

"16. To carry out the above and foregoing a committee shall be appointed, consisting of one member from each of the respective organizations named, as signers herein (not endorsers), together with one additional member at large. The member

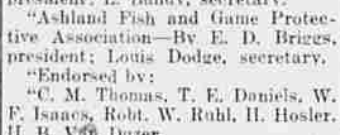

### FRESH EGGS ARE WANTED FOR THE BIG EASTER HUNT

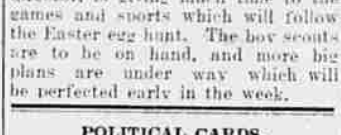

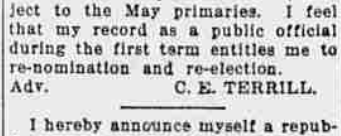
