

BAPTIST PASTOR RESIGNS TO TAKE UP STATE WORK

Rev. W. T. S. Spriggs, who resigned the pastorate of the First Baptist church two weeks ago, preached his farewell sermons Sunday and leaves today for Portland to fill an important position in the work of the Baptist state promotion society which will take him to all parts of the state.

During his successful pastorate here of two years and 3 months, Rev. Spriggs and family made many warm friends and acquaintances, who regret very much to have them leave Medford.

No definite steps have as yet been taken to fill the vacant pastorate here, but it is understood that executive board of the church will meet in the near future to act on this matter.

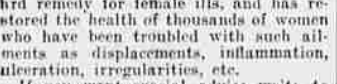

(Continued from Page One) the same late—wrecked houses, protrusion of wire communication and a death list.

A dozen or more Michigan cities were cut off from the rest of the world and it was reported they were in the path of the storm which swept northward across the state from Lake Michigan. The storm was said to have been particularly severe in the vicinities of Kalamazoo, Battle Creek, Lansing, Bay City and Saginaw.

In Ohio and Indiana, however, the tornado's fury apparently was wreaked on rural districts. None of the large cities was hit, according to reports. Sweeping over the open country and semi-isolated districts it was believed a number of persons had been killed and much property damaged.

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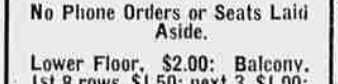
