FIRST MEETING OF NEW CHAMBER OF COMMERCE FRIDAY

The Chamber of Commerce will take its first step in the re-organization process on Friday night of this week when the new membership will meet at the library at eight o'clock to adopt a revised set of by-laws suitable for the kind of organization contemplated.

The by-laws committee, consisting of the executive committee and the campaign majors and captains, met Thursday afternoon at the headquarters and drafted a set of by-laws for submission to the membership on Friday night.

The installation work of the new organization is proceeding on schedule. Details are now being arranged for the primary and final elections that are to follow immediately after the adoption of by-laws. Mr. C. M. Thomas was appointed chairman of the elections committee and judge of elections, at the last meeting of the executive committee.

Membership group meetings will be held next week. The object of these meetings is to take a "thought survey" of Medford preparatory to the formulation of a program of work. Gaston Domergue has been appointed as chairman in charge of these meetings and will hold a meeting of his associate chairmen on Friday afternoon. There will be a series of meetings and a different chairman for each.

A one-day clean-up on membership was set for Monday, April 5, and the majors and team captains will meet at lunch Friday at the Medford to arrange the details.

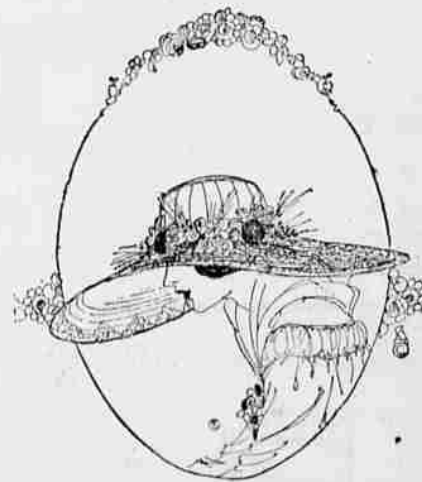
