### ORGANIZATION TO CLOSE THE ROGUE WILL BE FORMED

The following letter received by Mr. A. E. Reames is self explanatory: March 31st, 1920.

Mr. A. E. Reames, Medford, Ore.

Dear Sir: Your communication to the Medford Mail Tribune of March 30th relative to the agreement entered into between the Rogue River Fish & Game Protective Association and others, and Roderick McLeay, giving Mr. McLeay a complete monopoly of salmon fishing in Rogue river, was read before a meeting of the Josephine Sportsmen's league last night. As secretary of the league, I was directed to convey to you an expression of appreciation by the members of this association of the sentiments expressed in that communication and to advise you that those sentiments are most heartily endorsed by the Josephine Sportsmen's league.

This organization will give its earnest support to any effort to place an amendment to close Rogue river to all net fishing before the people at the next general election. A formal protest is being entered with the state fish and game commission against the agreement entered into at Medford with McLeay.

### NEW PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH WILL BE BUILT IN PHOENIX

Twenty-six new churches and fourteen manses in as many cities and towns will be built as a result of appropriations just made by the Board of Church Erection of the Presbyterian Church in the U. S. A. Dr. David G. Wylie, general secretary, announced today that \$161,629 will be used for church buildings and \$39,200 for manses.

The states which will receive new buildings include Pennsylvania, Maryland, North Dakota, California, Ohio, Oregon, Illinois, Washington, Tennessee, Idaho, South Dakota, Virginia, Texas, Arizona, Montana, Oklahoma, Kansas and North Carolina.

Baldstown, Calif.; Brawley, Calif.; Los Angeles, Calif.; Oakland, Calif.; Rodeo, Calif.; San Francisco, Calif.; San Juan, Calif.; Gold Beach, Ore.; McMinnville, Ore.; Portland, Ore.; Phoenix, Ore.

Cablegram from Cilicia says the Near East Relief permitted by French and Turks to relieve refugees marooned at Marash following great massacres.
