RUMANIA ACTS UPON TREATY

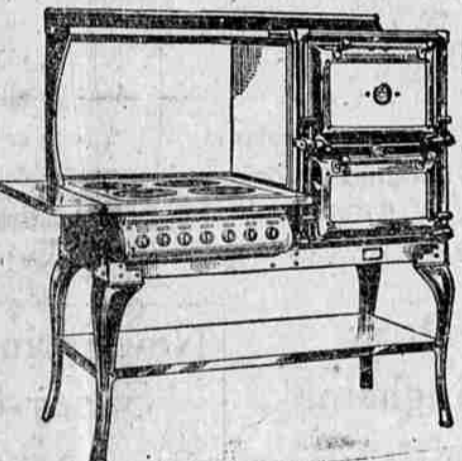
