TOO MUCH JOHNSON.

THE ONLY unexpected development in the Illinois primary is the vote given Senator Johnson. The Californian made no campaign, his name was not even on the ballot, but nearly 50,000 men and women took the trouble to write in his name.

There was no Senator Newberry scandal here to becloud the fundamental issue. The sensational support given Johnson, under the most unfavorable circumstances, demonstrates plainly that fighting Hiram, has behind him the united forces of insurgency and discontent.

This vote is a solid vote. It represents uncompromising hostility to any league of nations, it represents undying opposition to the political, social and economic status quo, it represents the bitterness of alien resentment, it represents the tremendous German vote of Chicago, which at the same time gave Mayor Thompson another four years lease on Cook county control.

A close analysis, therefore, reduces the impressiveness of the Johnson demonstration. For contrary to the statements of both the Wood and Lowden managers, the Johnson vote was not taken from them. A Wood supporter might vote for Lowden and a Lowden supporter for Wood, but under no circumstances would a Johnson supporter vote for either.

This is Johnson's strength and also his weakness. It is his strength for it gives him a working political force, which can't be alienated, it is his weakness, for this force, in the country today represents a minority, and in our judgment will continue to represent a minority.

That is to say in the convention, or in a clear-cut election, it is bound to be Johnson against the field. As demonstrated both in Michigan and Illinois the opposition united, has a clear working majority over the pro Johnson forces. Johnson is already a factor, and he is a political force to be reckoned with.
