## CENSUS DECREASE DUE TO WAR AND "FLU" EPIDEMIC

WASHINGTON, April 15.—A review of the population figures of the 49 cities and towns thus far announced was made public today by the census bureau. Comparative figures for 48 of these places in the last two decades show a decline of 6.5 per cent in the percentage of increase from 1910 to 1920 as compared with the 28.4 per cent gain during the preceding decade.

The remaining 21 places represent cities or towns which were not existing as separate communities in 1900.

Up to and including yesterday's announcement, the review showed an aggregate population of 10,958,315, an increase of 1,780,372 over 1910, or 21.9 per cent.

Falling off in the percentage of increase for the places announced was largely due to the "check on immigration which resulted from the world war," said Director Rogers of the bureau. Total immigration to the United States for the last ten years showed a decrease of 3,364,000 compared with the preceding decade.
