LARK EVANS IS AID TO JAILER, GIVES UP GUN

Lark Evans, who is still in the county jail awaiting the formal filing of a motion for a new trial, performed an act yesterday afternoon which under the circumstances has caused much favorable comment.

It became known last night that a juvenile prisoner in the county jail Wednesday afternoon, while playing around the jail, found in an open cell a .38 caliber revolver and a small sack of cartridges to fit it. The boy showed his find to Lark Evans, who immediately took it away from him and summoning the jailer, turned over to him the weapon.

When it is remembered that Evans is under a sentence of 15 years in the penitentiary which must be served unless he is granted a new trial, and eagerly longs for freedom, his action in turning over the weapon, when he easily might have used it to make his escape, is considered noteworthy.

Gus Newbury, his attorney, is expected today or Friday to file the formal motion for the new trial.

It is not known where the revolver and cartridges came from, but the weapon and ammunition were probably smuggled into the jail some time ago and concealed by some prisoner for use in a contemplated jail break which did not materialize.

LOWDEN'S LEAD OVER WOOD IS INCREASED

CHICAGO, April 15.—With only 297 precincts out of 5690 in the state missing, Governor Lowden's plurality over General Leonard Wood in Tuesday's presidential primary today reached 75,897.

The total of Senator Johnson's vote was not increased in the few precincts reported during the early morning and it remained 46,909 today.

DETROIT, Mich., April 15.—United States Senator Hiram W. Johnson carried Wayne county (Detroit) for the republican endorsement in the presidential preference primary by 58,724 over Major General Leonard Wood, according to the official canvass announced today. The figures were Johnson 77,648; Wood 18,924.

U. S. Ship Line to the Baltic.
DANZIG, April 15.—Arrangements with American shipping interests for fast Polish-American passenger and freight service between United States ports and the Baltic have been completed by Polish naval authorities.

RUSSIANS BLAME ALLIES FOR FALL OF VLADIVOSTOK

VLADIVOSTOK, April 6.—(By Associated Press.) All allied nations are held responsible for "the tragic results" of the Japanese attack which yesterday ousted the Russian revolutionary government from control.

He asks allied diplomats to propose to the Japanese that all Russians under arrest be released, that all government buildings held by Japanese be evacuated, that the Japanese government explain yesterday's attack and offer an apology to the revolutionary government, that Japanese troops cease searching buildings here and that arms taken forcibly from Russians be returned.

OKLAHOMA GAS FLOW IGNITED, MAN BURNED

NOWATA, Okla.—Fire caused by a match lighted by one of the tool dressers, destroyed the drilling rig owned by Charles Pritchard late Wednesday afternoon. The rig was drilling a well on the Roy E. Cobb farm in Section 5-25-15. Gas had been struck and the crew moved back the boiler and took every precaution to prevent the well taking fire. While the gas was issuing from the well, one of the members of the crew carelessly struck a match and in an instant the well and rig was aflame. The man who struck the match was burned about the face, but the others escaped injury. The loss is estimated at \$6,500 and is partially covered by insurance. The flowing gas well burned all night.

The strike was broken. Switchmen employed in the Chicago terminal of the Rock Island system, firemen and engineers on the Pennsylvania railroad and groups of strikers on the Soo line and other roads voted to end the walkout in Chicago and were returning to their jobs today. Normal freight conditions were being restored rapidly and embargoes were lifted by several roads.

Insurgents Deny Reports. The insurgent leaders, however, continued their claims that the position of the strikers remained unshaken and denied charges of Attorney General Palmer that radical influences were behind the strike.

In Michigan the industrial tieup continued serious with estimates that 150,000 workers, the largest number in Detroit, were idle. Additional na-

passenger trains were annulled because of the coal shortage.

Ohio cities reported industrial plants and coal mines closed at many centers, throwing 100,000 workers out of employment.

Brotherhood officials announced at Cleveland that 500 men voted to return today and that all the strikers employed by the Erie railroad and 80 per cent of the men employed in the Collinwood yard of the New York Central were at work. Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen officers named more than fifty cities in which strikers had resumed work.

Far West Improved. In the far west traffic was much improved and overland passenger trains which had been stalled at various points in California and Arizona were moving again toward their destinations.

The strike in the vicinity of Spokane, Wash., virtually ended with the return to work last night of striking switchmen.

Yards at San Bernardino, Barstow and Needles and Colton, Cal., were reported to be tied up, but freight began to move through the Pacific yards at Bakersfield, Cal.

Railroad and brotherhood officials in Kansas City announced that some men had deserted the insurgent ranks and that traffic conditions were improved.

Freight and express remained under a partial embargo in St. Louis but passenger service virtually was normal.

Strikers also were reported to have resumed work at Cheyenne, Wyo., and on the western division of the El Paso and Southern railroad, extending from El Paso to Tucson, Ariz.
