LOCAL DEMOCRATS MAY PUT ENTIRE TICKET IN FIELD

There is the possibility of the democrats of Jackson county putting a full ticket in the field for the coming primary election. This was developed at the luncheon of democrats held Thursday at the Hotel Medford, which was called by W. N. Campbell, county chairman at the behest of Mrs. Rose G. Schiefelin, state committeewoman for the party in Oregon, and Mrs. Satchell, county chairman of the women democrats.

The luncheon was attended by 40 persons, one-third of whom were women. H. C. Garnett was toastmaster. The political situation was talked over informally and Chairman Campbell appointed a committee to select candidates to fill out the important places on the ticket if that course is followed. If it is not the democrats will write in the names of selected ones of their political faith at the election. As the situation stands at present Rawley Moore, candidate for the democratic nomination for prosecuting attorney is the only democrat out in the open at the primary seeking office, but it is reported Dillon Hill will run for county commissioner.
