YOU HAVEN'T decided who you want for President. It is much easier for you to decide who you don't want. You don't want an old-fashioned politician. You are tired of politicians. You feel the present deplorable predicament of the country is largely due to too much politics and too little statesmanship.

You don't want a Bolshevik, you don't want a stand-patter. You want a man who has vision, but isn't visionary, who is more interested in deeds than in words, in performances than promises, and yet who in the struggle for efficiency can be depended upon never to lose sight of the supremely important human factor.

You want a man with ideals, but ideals tempered with practical horse sense, rationally adjusted not to the world we dream about, but the world we live in. Realizing that America enjoys the privileges of a world power, you realize also that it must accept the obligations of one.

You want a man in the White House who knows what he is talking about. In your opinion, a man who has lived in Europe and worked with Europeans who has lived in the Orient and worked with Orientals, who gets his knowledge of the world not from books and atlases but from first hand experience, will be in a better position to decide foreign policies wisely than the man who prides himself upon a provincialism entirely surrounded by ignorance.

Finally, the idea of having a business man in Washington appeals to you. The problems of the immediate future are the problems of reconstruction. The problems of reconstruction are primarily the problems of organization and administration, not political problems, but essentially business ones.

But you haven't decided who you want for President. You merely know you are on the right track, and a month from now will vote for the right man.

Misguided as the overall movement is in its immediate aim, it may serve a useful purpose in organizing public sentiment against the present mad race for profits, and convincing the profiteers they are skating on thin ice.

Mr. Bryan wins and loses in the Nebraska primaries. He secures a seat in the convention, but he is beaten in the race by two Hitchcock supporters. Now the debate can go on as to whether the Hitchcock support represents sentiment for the administration or for modified prohibition.

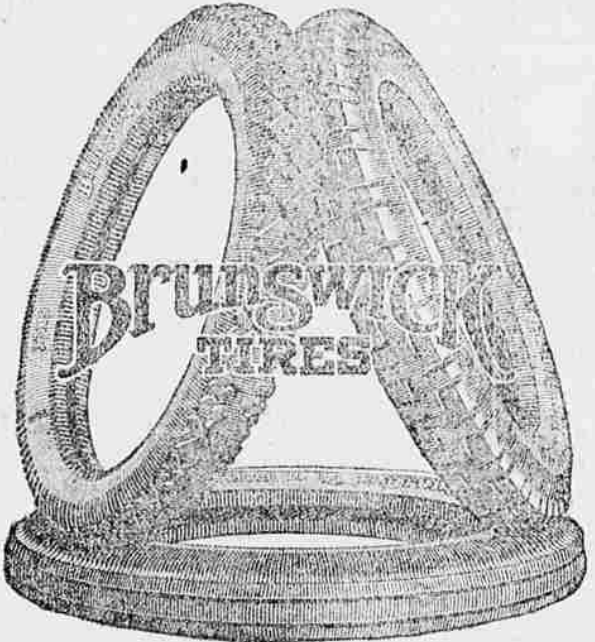
