## ASHLAND DRIVE COMMERCIAL CLUB NEAR 400 TOTAL

ASHLAND, April 23.—This morning ushered in the homestretch finale in the campaign drive in behalf of a community budget and the increasing of the Commercial club membership. Of the 400 minimum as to club representation, 320 had been secured up to Thursday evening upon the close of business hours as to the active canvass. Tuesday witnessed 123 members enrolled; Wednesday, 144; and Thursday, 53; total 320. Of the \$6000 budget which is sought to be raised, \$3291 had been pledged up to Thursday evening. The membership teams, under Majors A. C. Briggs and W. H. McNair, are running a close race, having succeeded on Thursday in securing 133 and 132 names respectively. For the three days' canvass Major McNair only led by the proverbial unlucky 13 majority.

Today will be the free-for-all, the respective teams being privileged to invade any territory whatever, heretofore having been restricted by district boundaries. Nearly 100 workers have been in the field, of which number about 75 gathered at the park entrance on Tuesday morning, and "looked pleasant" while being photographed in a composite group. On Tuesday the workers lunched at Hotel Austin; Wednesday and Thursday, at the Nelda Cafe; today at the Ashland hotel cafe, under new management, Messrs. Beaver & Noble, of Seattle, having lately assumed management of the dining room appointments at this house.

The youngest member of the reorganized Commercial club will not be known until the returns are all in, but it is safe to say that W. H. Smith, a pioneer of the early mining days in the vicinity of Henley, Siskiyou county, is the oldest, being 88 years of age. For the last few years he has been a resident of this city. Aside from individual memberships a number of clubs and other organizations have joined, including, the First Methodist Episcopal church, Auxiliary club, Fruit & Produce association, American Legion, Chamberlain & Palmer ranch, the proprietors of which are women from Boston, First Company C. A. C., and others. Fraternal and social societies might as well join first as last, inasmuch as extra features of moral suasion will be brought into requisition for the desired effect if the initial canvass does not win them over. The outlying districts have responded generously, while both Medford and Talent will figure in the returns. Tom Fanson of Medford, joined the procession on Thursday and Hattie Kram has retained a membership for so many years that he is well-nigh classed as a charter member.

Congratulations over the community boosting prospect in a general way and more specifically directed as a compliment to the successful auspices under which the campaign drive is being conducted, have poured in from all directions, greatly heartening the rank and file in their work and even Robert Leopold, connected with the American City Bureau, which has recently installed that corporation's services in Medford, paid his respects to the movement here in a letter of good will, which found expression preliminary to his leaving recently for other fields of labor in California. By Saturday evening it is expected that the campaign returns will all be in and tabulated, showing the status of the commercial club membership and the community budget; after which the directors of the club and trustees of the budget will formulate a program of activities in line with policies, which the members of the club and subscribers to the fund may recommend, if not dictate.

## ROSEBURG ATTY TO OPPOSE STANFIELD ON WORLD LEAGUE

ROSEBURG, April 23.—A circular letter sent by Attorney Albert Abraham of this city, candidate for U. S. senator, to his opponent on the republican ticket, Robert Stanfield, was given to the press today. The letter makes the league of nations a strict campaign issue with Attorney Abraham strictly opposed to the league of nations with or without reservations and Mr. Stanfield in favor of the league with reservations. The letter is as follows:

An open letter to the Honorable Robert N. Stanfield. Dear Sir: I am encouraged to believe that the republican press of the state will be pleased to publish this open letter to you which I am prompted to write in the interest of the republican party. We are about to enter upon a contest for the republican nomination for United States senator. It must be apparent to you that the winning candidate must be able to go before the general electorate with clean hands and with no taint or suspicion of any violation of the corrupt practices act. The most either of us is permitted to expend in the primary for the nomination is 15 per cent of the yearly salary, or the sum of \$1,125. The small amount of advertising either of us can legitimately get for this amount of money must be apparent. I am frank to state that I cannot afford to spend even this amount. This, therefore, is in a sense, an appeal to your generosity. The slight advantages there might be in such advertisement are insignificant when compared to the service we might render to our party, and consequently to our country, in setting a salutary precedent by conforming to the letter and spirit of the primary law.

You are standing on a distinct issue, that of favoring the league of nations with reservations. I am opposed to the league with or without reservations. There can be no question as to the issue between us. If the majority of the republican party are in favor of your position, you need not fear the issue. If they are in favor of mine, you should not want to represent them. The same is true of myself.

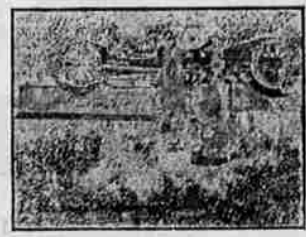
I therefore propose to you to join with me in a frank statement to the republican party that we will submit the question of our candidacy to them upon the above issue, without further expense to either of us except such as may be necessary to fairly present the issue to the electorate; that there shall be no advertisement of our candidacies, except to make known our positions upon the league of nations; and that, whenever there is advertisement of the position of either of us, the other shall, included in the same advertisement, at the same time and place, receive the same amount of advertisement as to his position. This is a plain business proposition which should appeal to you. Furthermore, it would permit the whole party to give a full and free expression of its position on the great question before the people.

## ROSEBURG TO PAY A \$90 BONUS TO SCHOOL TEACHERS

ROSEBURG, April 23.—W. R. Rutherford, principal of the Eugene city schools, spent Tuesday in this city in an attempt to hire the teachers now engaged in giving instruction to the school children of this city. Mr. Rutherford has been having considerable trouble in Eugene, and practically all of the teachers of that city have refused to sign contracts for another year. They have objected to Mr. Rutherford's methods and have declined to serve for another term unless a new principal is obtained. The city principal declared he could get other teachers and is now out visiting other cities in an effort to employ teachers for the coming year. So far as could be learned he was successful in securing contracts with seven local teachers, four from the Rose school, two from the Fullerton school. The results of his efforts are announced unofficially entirely, and are based upon his own statements.

The school board at a meeting Monday night took the local situation into serious consideration, and listened to the advice of a large number of teachers who were present at request. After careful consideration of the complaints that have been made regarding the recent schedule which was adopted by the board, and figuring out the amount of money available, it was decided to give a bonus of \$90 to grade teachers and \$67.50 to high school teachers at the end of the year to all except principals, who serve until the close of the year 1920-21. This will bring the lowest salary paid to \$105 per month.

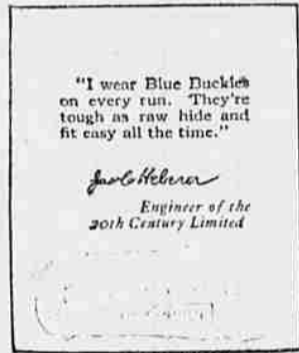
