Three other states have filed applications for admission to the league, the republics of Georgia, San Marino and Luxembourg.

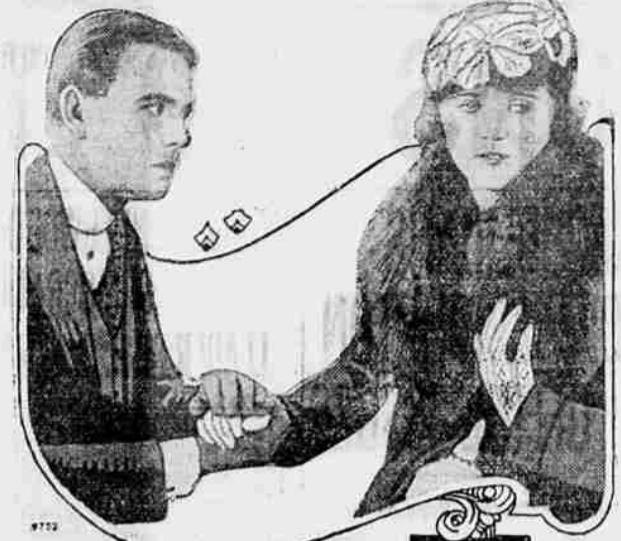
SPRING FEVER CAUSED DEFEAT OF BOLSHIEVIKI

## SPOKANE SCHOOLBOY COMMITS SUICIDE

SPOKANE, April 27.—Bernard Lindley, 14 years of age, a schoolboy, was found early today in the furnace room of a local hotel where he was employed, shot through the heart. The coroner said he had committed suicide. The boy's father, Alba A. Lindley, declared his son had been falsely accused of having stolen a small amount of money from a room in the hotel. His body was found by his brother, also employed at the hotel.

## 800 PEOPLE KILLED CABRERA REVOLUTION

SAN SALVADOR, Republic of Salvador, April 27.—Men, women and children numbering 800 were killed in the recent fighting in Guatemala City during the revolt which resulted in the overthrow of President Manuel Estrada Cabrera, according to latest advices. Numerous adherents of Cabrera were killed in their own houses, the advices say.

Many Guatemalans who fled from the country are returning and are being received with enthusiasm.

## 2 KILLED IN GAS PLANT EXPLOSION

DES MOINES, Ia., April 27.—Two men were killed, two are missing and five were injured by an explosion in the engine room of the Des Moines city gas plant early today. The explosion shook buildings all over the city. All industries dependent upon gas fuel are at a standstill and thousands went breakfastless. The cause of the explosion has not been announced.

It will be several days if not weeks before gas can be turned into the city mains again, it was said. Property loss is estimated at \$200,000.

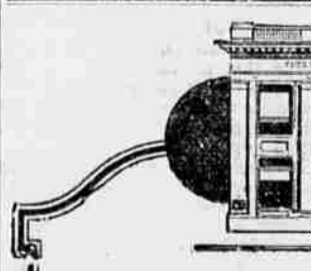

## DEMAND RECORDS SHIP BUILDERS IN PORTLAND DISTRICT

PORTLAND, Ore., April 27.—United States District Judge Bean today issued an order for a subpoena duces tecum, ordering production of all records of the Columbia River Shipbuilding Corporation and the Northwest steel company for a federal grand jury investigation of alleged frauds in connection with the construction of vessels for the emergency fleet corporation.

The companies, according to the order, must turn over all of their records to the grand jury for examination.

The motion for the order was made yesterday upon the opening of court, and the entire day was spent in arguing the motion. Charges that the present department of justice investigation of local shipyards is inspired by certain politicians in Washington, D. C., who are alleged to be seeking to further the presidential ambitions of Attorney General Palmer, were made during arguments yesterday by Dan J. Malarky of counsel for the shipbuilding companies.

## TEACHERS MUST QUIT UNIONS OR LOSE JOBS

SAN FRANCISCO, April 27.—Notification that they must give up their labor union affiliations or lose their positions with the city were received by members of the teachers and firemen's unions through the mails today. The notifications were sent out following a conference between representatives of the board of supervisors, the board of education and the California state building trades council to discuss the subject yesterday.
