In the Garden

Cucumbers muskmelons, pumpkins, watermelons and citron are not adapted to growing in the extremely small garden. Cucumbers however, can be grown along a fence or side of a building and trained upon a wire trellis, so that they do not occupy very much space. Muskmelons can be grown in the same manner providing lines are furnished to support the melons. Space here permits only a discussion of squashes, cucumbers and muskmelons. Five or six hills of summer squashes planted four feet apart in each direction will produce enough young tender squashes for the average family. Summer squashes require plenty of heat and should not be planted until the ground is reasonably warm. If possible, the hills should be made a week or two in advance of planting the seed, a little well-rotted manure and a tablespoonful of fertilizer being thoroughly mixed with the soil of each hill. Plant about seven or eight seeds to the hill, covering one-half inch deep. When the plants are up, thin to three or four.

Young squash seedlings are sometimes attacked by the striped cucumber beetle but it is an easy matter to protect a few hills by covering each one with a small piece of wire fly screen. After the plants are 10 days or two weeks old this type of beetle does not bother them. Summer squashes should always be used when young, while the skin is so tender that it can yet be punctured with the fingernail. Other varieties of squashes

adapted for garden growing are the Hubbard and Boston Marrow. These are especially good for baking, and may be kept well into the winter. Cucumbers should be planted and banded in the same manner as the squashes, except that the hills should be a little farther apart. Two or three hills will furnish enough cucumbers for the average family, unless a larger supply is desired for pickles. Muskmelons require plenty of space, and so should only be planted in the large garden. Ten hills of Rocky Ford muskmelons, spaced five feet apart in each direction will generally supply muskmelons for the average family. However, this season of production is comparatively short. The culture is the same as for the squashes and cucumbers. It is well to give them a little additional fertilizer scattered within two or three feet of the hills at the time that the plants are being cultivated. The same precautions as to insects must be taken as with squashes and cucumbers. A little dry road dust or powdered lime sprinkled over and around the plants may keep the bugs away, but the safest method is to cover them with the wire fly screen or with cheesecloth supported on little pegs and the edges weighted with soil. The covering should be removed just as soon as the plants are sufficiently toughened to withstand the beetles' attacks.
