ROME, May 4.—After an interval of fifty years the Coliseum again has been the scene of the moving and pictures-que ceremony of the Via Crucis. Pope Benedict XIV, who resided as pope from 1740 to 1758, instituted the ceremony by placing a cross in the center of the arena, where martyrs had given their lives for the faith, and erecting fourteen stations of the cross about the historic pile.
