DROWN THE H. C. L. IN MILK.

THE FACT has been established that milk and fresh vegetables are essential articles of diet for the growing child. The milk drive which is being conducted in Jackson county this week, the first of a series throughout the state, is therefore a drive which deserves the support of every person interested in the public welfare.

A recent survey in Medford shows that one-third of the school children drink no milk at all. This is a deplorable condition. It constitutes a menace not only to the growing child, but to the community as a whole.

Moreover, a milk drive means a drive against the high cost of living. For it is also a scientific fact that the essential food elements, the elements which nourish and energize, found in a quart of milk are greater than found in any other food, costing three and four times as much. In other words the child can not get along without milk, while the adult can save money every day by introducing milk in the daily diet.

This is not a drive for the benefit of milk dealers, although of course the milk dealers will be benefitted. It is a drive for the benefit of our children, and the benefit of the community at large. A greater consumption of milk and green vegetables, particularly in the spring and summer, will mean not only less disease and more health, but a better diet for less money.

VOTE FOR GOOD ROADS.

JACKSON COUNTY faces the greatest era of prosperity in its history. There may be temporary set backs, but with irrigation and lumber mills assured, assuring in their turn greater productivity of the land and augmented pay rolls, better and better times are as certain, as anything can be in a somewhat uncertain world.

It would seem then the last time in the world, to adopt a timid attitude toward good roads, particularly when those good roads can be built largely by outside money.

A vote for the county bond issue and a vote for the 4 per cent increase, which does not increase taxes, but merely gives Jackson County its share of funds already provided, must appeal to every resident who investigates the situation carefully, as a business opportunity which Jackson County simply can't afford to miss.

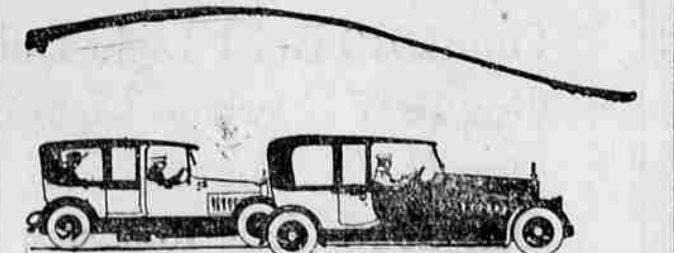


Rippling Rhymes

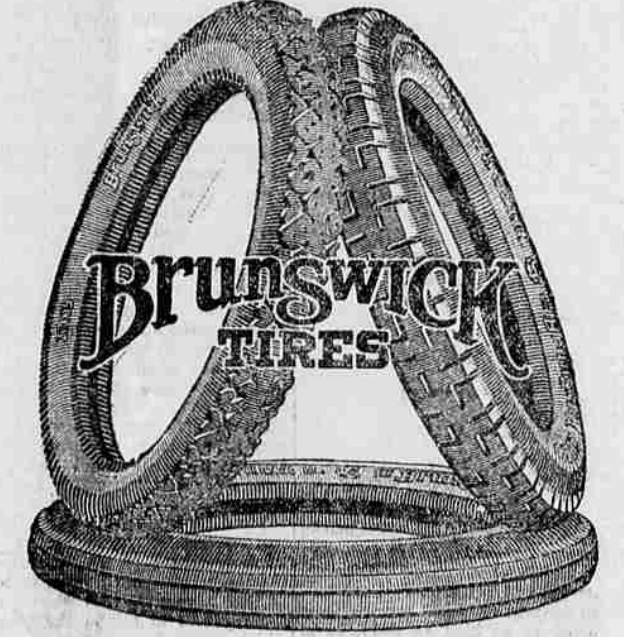

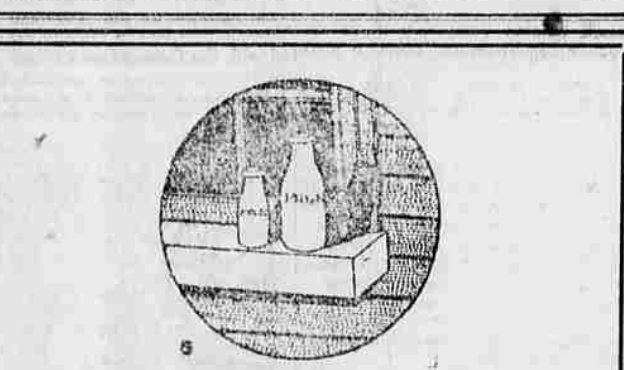

PRAIRIE SCHOONER ON REPUBLIC TRUCK

Mine Develops Vehicle to Serve All Purposes.

The Prairie Schooner recalled in stories of the early west, will always prove interesting when considering the development of our transportation facilities. Every once in a while this relic of transportation is brought to light in a modern way, and this was strikingly illustrated in a recent adaptation of a Republic motor truck operated by the Tungsten-Comet Mining Co., of Panaca, Nevada. This company is situated seventeen miles from the nearest railroad and this condition brought about the need of solving the company's daily transportation requirements, both as to passengers and freight.

Realizing that it was not practical to have a number of vehicles which would necessarily be idle a part of the time, the Tungsten-Comet Mining company installed a 2-ton Republic truck with a type of body to meet their local conditions. A passenger automobile tonneau seat was furnished for the driver and for his protection a roadster top was attached. Over the body of the truck a canvas top was built along lines adapted from the old-fashioned prairie schooner that traversed the western plains fifty years ago. This unique vehicle is used to haul passengers and supplies from the railroad to the company's mine, as well as conveying express shipments of high grade concentrates which the company produces.
