Miss Florence Pool, home demonstration agent, who is conducting the milk campaign, spoke on "The Necessity for Milk in the Diet." Mrs. Muddox presided.

The general public is invited to the city park Saturday afternoon at 3 o'clock when the school children will appear as milk fairies in a pageant. In addition to this programme talks have been given in all the schools and motion picture houses are showing educational slides and window displays are on view in the Chamber of Commerce, Paul's Electric Store and the Toggery. The Commercial Club will give a luncheon Saturday which will be an event of note. The Farm Bureau is preparing an exhibit of feeds to show what a cow eats while manufacturing a gallon of milk.

The exhibit shown by the Commercial Club is prepared by the Oregon Dairy Council, arranged by Dr. D. W. Mack, Dairy Inspector of Portland, and it shows the mineral content of milk.

Portland is planning to pattern after Medford in the fall and put on some of these milk features when the Parent-Teacher association meets there.
