follows, to-wit: Beginning at the intersection of Jackson and Roosevelt streets in the City of Medford, Jackson County, Oregon, thence in a northeasterly direction along the present road as near as practicable through the Town of Eagle Point, Jackson County, Oregon, thence following the route now staked out in a northerly direction passing the present Reese Creek school in said county and state, and terminating at the town of Trail, Jackson County, Oregon, said terminus being 1500 feet east and 920 feet south of the section corner common to sections 33 and 34, Township 23 South, Range 1 West of the Willamette Meridian, and Sections 4 and 3, Township 24 South, Range 1 West of the Willamette Meridian.
