less revolution of a few weeks' duration. To Abolish Saloons The Mexican president and his party were captured near Arizaco, having left the capital Friday. Carranza has been granted safety by General Alvaro Obregon, presidential candidate and revolutionist whose death warrant was said to have been signed by Carranza prior to the former's escape from Mexico City.

Statements from revolutionary leaders said the new regime would welcome foreign capital in the development of the nation's resources, lives and property were promised protection and a reform movement would be inaugurated to prohibit gambling and abolish saloons.

EL PASO, Texas, May 11.—The forces of General Alvaro Obregon are pursuing President Carranza and his adherents between San Marcos, Puebla and Arizaco, Thlaxcala, according to Esquivel Salcedo, formerly a member of Obregon's staff, who arrived in El Paso today from Arizaco.

### RECEIVES LETTER FROM SON KILLED IN WORLD WAR

The following very touching letter was received recently by R. H. Stanley of Ashland from his daughter-in-law in Rhondda Valley, Wales. The letter was written by her husband, Mr. Stanley's son, shortly before his death from wounds received in service on the western front. Mr. Stanley who is an Englishman, lost two sons in the war:

Dear Sweetheart and Wife: God be with you till we meet again. If it should please God to take me away, I write these few lines in the hope that someone will post them on to you. Enclosed you will find our's and Gwefry's (God bless her) photograph and my prayer book which when Gwefry grows up you will give it to her as a present from her Daddie. Grieve not Sweetheart mine yet a little while and we shall meet again in that grand place where there will be no more tears and sorrow only joy, the joy that passeth all understanding. God will be good to you and our dear little one Gwefry I know. Bring her up in the Faith Maggie Bach, teach her the way to Salvation. You shall come to no harm Maggie for I shall watch over you wherever you go. So be not afraid, but pray to God for strength and guidance and he will look after you. I thank God with all my heart for giving me such a good wife and a healthy child, and I love you Maggie mine, more than words can say. "Oh God how long wilt thou be angry?" Have mercy on the people Lord, Give my love to Mam, Daddie, Edith, Lizzie Jane, Olwyn, Eddie Gwen, and Gwyneth, and kindest regards to Watkin and David. And now Sweetheart, goodbye for a short time and God bless and keep you and Gwefry and all at home, and remember me as your ever loving husband, Frank.

### GENERAL WOOD IS HIGHLY PRAISED BY CHAUTAUQUA MAN

As the personal representative of General Leonard Wood Montaville Flowers of Los Angeles, the well known Chautauqua lecturer, author and active political worker in past presidential campaigns, addressed a gathering of over 200 persons at the natatorium last night, in behalf of Wood's candidacy for president.

He indulged in no personalities about other candidates, but confined his remarks to straightforward argument intended to show Wood as the ablest and most efficient candidate available. With due deference to all the other candidates he declared that Wood has had more varied experience fitting him for the presidency than any of our presidents had had before becoming president.

In his two hour's address he made it plain that in his belief the contest was between Wood and Hiram Johnson for the Republican nomination, and that the people would overwhelmingly demand Wood. "A vote for Wood is a vote against Johnson," he said.

Mr. Flowers called attention to the spirit of unrest throughout the country, much of which was fostered by a radical foreign element, which he said if not curbed might keep on growing until it threatened the very principles of the declaration of independence, and to check which and restore normal conditions required the election to the presidency of an able, conservative, tested, typical efficient American of wide administrative experience, like Leonard Wood.

Then the orator sank the fangs of poison by inference into Hiram Johnson by saying: "If we capitalize all the foreign element and spirit of unrest in this country under one head and elect him as president, no matter how honest he is and what he personally feels of patriotism he will find himself powerless to contend with the new strikes, dissensions, riots and troubles which will have arisen through his very election by his having catered to this element, until the very existence of our government is threatened.

With regard to the attacks made upon Wood by his political opponents about the prodigious use of money in his campaign, Mr. Flowers declared that "every dollar of ours is an honest dollar and is honestly and legitimately spent." He declared the Wood campaign was principally financed by William Cooper Proctor, the millionaire soap manufacturer, and the wealthy fathers of sons who attended Wood's military training camps.

I felt like saying 'well, nothing was ever done so systematically as nothing is being done now.' Therefore, I should like to see something unusual happen, something that was never done before; and inasmuch as the things that are being done to you were ever done before, don't you think it is worth while to try something that was never done before against those who are doing them to you? "There is no other way to win. \* \* \* America is the prize amateur nation of the world. Germany is the prize professional nation of the world. Now, when it comes to doing new things and doing them well, I will back the amateur against the professional every time. He knows so little about it that he is fool enough to try the right thing. The men that do not know the danger are the rashest men.

### Leave Out Prudent

"Please leave out of your vocabulary altogether the word 'prudent.' \* \* \* Do the thing that is audacious to the utmost point of risk and daring, because that is exactly the thing that the other side does not understand.

"I think that there are willing ears to hear this in the American navy and the American army because that is the kind of folks we are. We get tired of the old ways and covet the new ones.

"I am not discouraged for a moment, particularly because we have not even begun and, without saying anything in disparagement of those with whom we are associated in the war, I do expect things to begin when we begin. If they do not, American history will have changed its course; the American army and navy will have changed their character. There will have to come a new tradition into a service which does not do new and audacious and successful things.

### FRESH SUPPLY OF GOPHER POISON IS RECEIVED BY GATE

The county agent has obtained a fresh supply of gopher poison put up in small tin cans that sells for fifty cents a can. Each can contains

enough poison to treat four quarts of parsnips or carrots. The gopher runways are located and two or three pieces of the poisoned bait are placed in the runways and the holes are covered up with dirt. This has proved a very successful method of controlling this pest and many farmers are reporting favorably on this method. The damage done to farm and garden crops is quite extensive in this county and every one pestered with gophers should try this poisoned bait. The county agent will be glad to furnish specific directions for the eradication of gophers to all who will communicate with him.
