## EXPECT ITALIAN CABINET TO FALL IN NEAR FUTURE

ROME, May 13.—The cabinet crisis is considered one of the most difficult to solve because the chamber is divided chiefly into two groups, socialists and catholics, neither of which is strong enough to constitute a majority, while an agreement between them is impossible on a common program.

In addition the socialists absolutely refuse to participate in a government. Some of the deputies suggest a cabinet formed by Signor Meda, leader of the catholics, with Signor Lenomi, the present minister of war, as leader of the reformist socialists.

Other deputies predict that Signor Nitti again will be entrusted with the task of forming a cabinet, because they say, there is no man who controls the opposition. In case Nitti assumes the task, it is believed he will ask moderate socialists, like Deputy Turati, leader of the intransigents, Deputy Treves, and Deputy Modigliani to enter the cabinet and if they refuse, that he will form a new administration with catholics, giving them some important portfolios, especially the portfolio of instruction, as the radical reform school system is one of the fundamental points in the program of the catholics.

## SIMS DELAYED U. S. TROOP SHIP FOR OVER MONTH

WASHINGTON, May 13.—Mr. Daniels objected today that Admiral Sims had objected to the use of the former German liner Leviathan as a troop ship on the ground that her great length made her a better target for torpedoes than smaller vessels. He also said the admiral had contended that the ship should be operated to Liverpool rather than to Brest because of better facilities for handling her cargo.

The department, the secretary said followed the admiral's advice with the result that the Leviathan had to await an entire lunar month at Liverpool before she could get out of the harbor. Later the Leviathan operated out of Brest where her turn around "was measured in hours instead of weeks and she broke all records in the number of troops transported."

Mr. Daniels presented various official documents to support his contention that the convoy system was originally sponsored by the American navy and that it was not adopted fully until several months after the United States entered the war and had sent many destroyers and other craft overseas thus providing the ships to make the operation of the convoy system possible.

## TRANSFER CRITICISED

Mr. Wilson also criticised a pending proposal to transfer the bureau of efficiency which checks up on methods of government business from the jurisdiction of the congress. This, the president said, was "another illustration of the tendency to which I invite attention."

"In considering bills containing the provisions mentioned above," the president's message concluded, "I was willing to overlook the objectionable features for the time being with the thought that they were designed as exceptional and temporary measures to meet unusual conditions. To permit such expedients to serve as precedents or accepted rules for legislation would in my judgment, be most unfortunate and destruction of proper principles for the orderly and efficient management of the government's business."

LOS ANGELES, May 13.—Sheriff Cline announced today that because of numerous threats made against the life of James P. Watson, who recently pleaded guilty to the murder of Nina Lee Delaney, and is alleged to have confessed the murders of eight other women he had wed, the prisoner will be taken secretly to San Quentin prison to serve the life sentence imposed on him here.

The sheriff said he would probably remove Watson from the county hospital by automobile and drive him to some station a considerable distance from Los Angeles before boarding a train.

This action was taken by the republican state convention here today by a vote of 753 to 746.

INDIANAPOLIS, May 13.—United States Senators James E. Watson and Harry S. New, Governor James P. Goodrich and former Senator Albert J. Beveridge were elected Indiana's "big four" delegates at large to the republican national convention at Chicago. On the same motion E. M. Wasmuth, state chairman; Mrs. Chas. A. Carlisle of South Bend, and Mrs. Joseph B. Keating of Indianapolis and W. A. Gains of Evansville were elected alternates.
