BIBLE INSTITUTE ASHLAND TO TAKE PLACE OF ROUNDUP

ASHLAND, May 14.—Advantage both spiritual as well as material will mark the holding of the Moody Bible Institute in this city the coming summer, the dates being from July 25 to Aug. 22, there being available nearly a month's session of educational privileges of the highest order. Occurring after the chautauqua season is over, the school will in no wise conflict with the activities of the annual assembly period. Later announcements will follow in due season, but preliminary attention is called to specific merits of the curriculum which the noted Bible study course affords, as follows:

1. Just as an individual must be balanced to be normal—to have equally developed the intellectual, spiritual and physical phases of his personality—so with a community. The Chamber of Commerce has an admirable program for the material development of the community. To be normal and healthy the spiritual growth must keep pace with the physical or we will lose sight of the finest things in life. The Bible Institute will do just this for the community.
2. In that it is un-denominational yet thoroughly Christian it will appeal to people who, for reason of their own, mistrust denominationalism, and will give these the benefit of the ripest Christian scholarship of the day.
3. It will be a unifier of the religious forces of the community, making possible a healthier cooperation and sweeter Christian fellowship.
4. It will stimulate religious activity, re-invigorate local churches, enlist new people in the great program of the church, create an interest in the great, noble, worth-while and fundamental things of life.
5. But there is also a very material advantage in this Bible Institute. If plans contemplated mature, many people will tent in the community during Chautauqua and continue thru the institute. This will enliven business and bring trade benefits to our merchants.

It will bring more revenue than did the Roundup which brought great crowds for a few days; for, while no great mass of people will gather at any one time their longer stay will more than compensate for the lesser number.

6. It will put our fine Chautauqua building to an admirable use, and thus help make us feel more that the structure fills a real need in the community.
