

GERMANS REFUSE TO ATTEND SPA

LONDON, May 14.—The German cabinet, after a full discussion with the ministers of the federal states, decided unanimously that Germany should not send representatives either to the Spa or Brussels conference unless French troops are entirely withdrawn from the main district by May 16, according to a Central News dispatch from Berlin today.
