THREE OVERCOME IN IDAHO MINE, CREWS TO RESCUE

SPOKANE, May 14.—Fred Dergen, superintendent of the Marsh mine near Burke, Idaho, Charles Johnson and a third man whose name could not be learned, were overcome by gas at the bottom of a 240-foot shaft in the mine today and it is feared they cannot be rescued in time to prevent asphyxiation, according to information received here over the long distance telephone today.

Rescue crews from the Hecla mine were attempting to reach the men with gas masks. Their plight was made known by a fourth man, who descended with them but who managed to escape the fumes before he was overcome.

The men entered the shaft this forenoon before the gas from a blast had been dispersed, it was declared.

SPARKS FROM THE WIRE

Lieutenant W. H. Cushing and Ensign Frank Lamb, naval reserve officers, have been recommended for court martial in a report submitted to the navy by a board of inquiry, charging them with having transported twelve cases of liquor in a naval seaplane from Bemini, one of the Bahama islands, to Key West, Fla., on a recent cruise down the Atlantic coast.

The U. S. S. Nereus is expected to arrive at New York next Monday or Tuesday from Brest, bearing the bodies of 153 officers and enlisted men of the navy and marine corps. Arrangements have been made for appropriate services Wednesday afternoon on the pier with Secretary Daniels as principal speaker.

Yesterday was especially observed throughout Hungary in the holding of demonstrations against the peace treaty, says a Budapest dispatch.

It is reported currently that Mustafa Kemal Pasha has formed a government in Ankara and addressed a telegram to the peace conference declaring that any acceptance of peace terms by the present Turkish peace delegation will be null and void, according to a Constantinople dispatch.

The body of a beautiful young Russian woman has been found in Lake Geneva off Ouchy. On the reverse side of a banknote found upon her was written, "Good bye. Am another victim of the bolsheviks." It was signed "Countess W." She is the sixth Russian noblewoman to commit suicide by drowning in Lake Geneva.

W. A. Watt, treasurer of the Australian commonwealth, now in England, is bringing before the English people the question whether there is to be a continuance of the Anglo-Japanese alliance.

Secretary of State Colby declared last night in an address in Chicago that America's position in the world today is "quite the reverse of isolation" and pointed out that the United States had been saved from the actual test of war in defending the Monroe doctrine. Secretary Colby defended the League of Nations.

Secretary of Commerce Alexander expressed a hope for continued friendly relations between this country and Great Britain at a dinner given in Washington last night in honor of the British merchants now touring the United States.

A 15 per cent advance in wages is to be demanded for every iron, steel and tin worker affiliated with the Amalgamated Association of Iron, Steel and Tin Workers, according to the report of the scale committee to the convention in Seanton, Pa., yesterday.

into account the cost of necessities, savings and the enjoyment of all benefits of the civilization of the time. Senator Phipps, republican, Colorado, called attention to the bonus paid employees by many industrial enterprises and to reports that labor leaders felt it should be discouraged.

Division of Surplus

"In the actual practice of the operation of the various devices they fall into two general classes—sharing of profits and sharing of savings," Mr. Hoover said. "It is difficult to reach a fair basis of settlement. The occasional misuse of the system has led to the opposition of organized labor."

If profit sharing is to be based on the conception that wages are to be just, and that profits are to be an addition to pay, then it would be in proper form, but not when used as a weapon to hold down a man's pay. The intangible agitation in industrial life concerns the question of a division of surplus, not the question that employees want to manage the business."
