BURSELL STATES POLICY REGARDING GOOD ROAD WORK

Victor Bursell, the successful farmer and business man for county commissioner has been a resident of Jackson county for the past 37 years. Has seen and kept pace with the development of the valley. He has seen the roads improved from mere mud holes over which teams could hardly pass to their present state.

He believes the people should vote yes for the 4 per cent limitation amendment so as to provide funds as needed to complete the Pacific highway and all work under construction and thinks we should vote the county road bonds so our county court will be able and ready to cooperate with the state highway commission and government in the construction of roads as planned by the issue.

Our present highway commission does not plan on expending this sum at once but thru a period of years as needed, so that the bonds would not all be sold at one time but only as required.

4:00 a. m. to 11:00 a. m.
4:00 p. m. to 11:00 p. m.

MONDAY, WEDNESDAY AND FRIDAY, on the East side of the Streets running North and South, and North side of all Streets running East and West.

TUESDAY, THURSDAY AND SATURDAY, on the West side of all Streets running North and South, and on the South side of all Streets running East and West.

SUNDAY FORENOON, on the East side of all Streets running North and South, and on the North side of all Streets running East and West.

SUNDAY AFTERNOON on the West side of all Streets running North and South, and the South Side of all Streets running East and West.

Corner property will be governed by the street on which the house is numbered.
