LATEST NEWS OF THE STATE

HOOD RIVER, Ore., May 17.—R. Clay Crawford, held in jail on a charge of defrauding W. M. Bailey, principal of the high school, of \$500, had a narrow escape early yesterday when the old city hall and jail, the attic of which was gutted, caught fire from an overheated flue.

SALEM, Ore., May 17.—From \$250,000 to \$300,000 worth of bridge construction is being done or has been completed on the Pacific highway between the California line and Portland, according to C. B. McCullough, bridge engineer for the state highway department.

SALEM, May 17.—Because of the vast territory covered by western classifications in the proposed general freight rate increases relative to which the inter-state commerce commission will begin a hearing in Washington on May 24, it is strongly probable that the Oregon public service commission will contend for separate hearing on Oregon rates.

PORTLAND, May 17.—Forty-two Chicago businessmen, members of the Chicago Association of Commerce, arrived in Portland today on a special train from San Francisco where they attended the seventh national foreign trade convention.

The American legation at Warsaw is strongly urging the war department at Washington to allow the American sanitary unit to remain in Poland for some time instead of leaving June 30 when the cleansing of ten thousand Americans who had been in the Polish army will be completed.

CAN VOTE BONDS WITHOUT RAISING COUNTY TAX RATE

A careful study of the tabulated road mileage statement issued by County Judge G. A. Gardner and Commissioners James Owens and George Owen, discloses the fact that the long standing warrant indebtedness which has been hanging over the county for a great many years will be paid in full within a year and a half from the present time.

The warrant indebtedness originally was more than for a half million dollars and more than the present proposed county road bond issue.

It will not be necessary to sell bonds of the proposed issue until 1921. The regular annual two mill tax for warrant indebtedness will be discontinued in 1922 when interest on the proposed road bond issue becomes due.

There would be no levy for sinking fund for the proposed road bonds until 1925 and that would be 1.5 mill. There being no levy then for warrant indebtedness and the mill rate for interest and sinking fund for Pacific Highway bonds being so reduced that even with the full rate of taxation for the proposed bonds, the total rate will be less in 1925 and thereafter than at the present time.

The facts disclosed in the statement of the county judge and commissioners take into consideration that the present valuation of the county will remain as it is.

The people of Jackson county must solve their road problem. Lane county or any other county is not going to help, nor can we be of any assistance to Lane county in solving her road problem, which involves a bond issue of two million dollars which is to be voted upon at this election.

Every county in the state is banking on getting some state and federal aid for their roads, but unless the bond limitation is raised from 2 to that of 4 per cent, the state will not be in position to match government money and the same will be passed on to some more progressive state where voters are awake to the fact that two dollars will build twice the amount of road than what one dollar will.

Delegates of the League of Nations will request President Wilson who is to issue the formal call for the next meeting, to designate some European city as the place for the meeting rather than Washington, as was originally planned, according to Rome reports.

17 VIOLATORS OF WATER REGULATION PUT UNDER ARREST

Chief of Police Timothy and Free Chief Lawton made the rounds of the city in midday Sunday, during the hours in which it is illegal to irrigate lawns and gardens, and found 17 water users in various parts of the city violating the city ordinance in various ways in addition to using water during the prohibited hours.

All have been technically placed under arrest and notified to appear before Police Judge Taylor. Despite the fact that the water ordinance has been published in large type in advertisements in The Mail Tribune and appeared no later than Saturday, there seems to be some confusion on the part of a minority of water users as to when they can use water, and others deliberately do not care and try to get away with their violations.

On Sunday all irrigating is prohibited between the hours of 11 a. m. and 4 p. m.

Government authorities captured seventeen Chinese, six quarts of some liquid thought to be an opiate 1000 quarts of whiskey; 1500 quarts of cognac, fourteen five-gallon demijohns of aquadiente and five demijohns of Cuban wine on board the Cuban schooner Reemplazo off the coast at Tarpon Springs and brought into Tampa, Fla.

NEW FISH AND GAME OFFICIALS SEE AMENT DAM

Capt. Burghdoff, the newly appointed state game warden, and Ed Clanton, master fish warden, were at the Ament dam yesterday to inspect the new fish way.

The visitors expressed themselves as satisfied that the new fishway would serve the purpose intended and that the upper river, and the hatchery at Trail would see better conditions than heretofore. Some of the local men were more skeptical. "The fish way is just being completed and has not been tested under operating conditions," said Mr. Sheldon upon his return, "so it is not fair to condemn it. I hope it fulfills its purpose. But I am frank to say that I fear that further effort must be made before the conditions to which we are entitled in the upper river are secured.

Eighty thousand American flags are being sent out by the Memorial day committee in Paris to the various cemeteries so that there will be an ample supply available for the ceremonies of May 30. Wreaths and flowers are to decorate the graves of 22,000 American soldiers.
