

AD CLUB STARTS AUTO CARAVAN TO STOCKTON, CAL.

SEATTLE, May 17.—Forty-five automobiles, carrying members of the Pacific Coast division of the Pacific Coast Ad club's British Columbia-to-Stockton, Cal., caravan, were started on their way from the city-county building by Mayor Caldwell at 7:30 this morning under ideal weather and road conditions. Governor Louis F. Hart and the members of the state highway commission headed the caravan, which they will accompany to Portland. An army contingent from Camp Lewis is scheduled to join the party at Tacoma. A Red Cross ambulance accompanied the caravan and a service car trailed behind for the benefit of the stragglers. The British Columbia delegates arrived in Seattle Sunday night and took a prominent place in the caravan. The schedule calls for arrival of the travelers in Stockton, 1300 miles from Seattle, one week from today.
